**LICENSING APPEAL ORDER**

On March 4, 2015, Kyle Bahri (applicant) filed a request for a new Salesperson license.

At a meeting held on March 18, 2015, the Commission denied this request under administrative rules R 436.1105(2)(g)(i), R 436.1105(2)(g)(ii), R 436.1105(2)(g)(iv) and R 436.1105(2)(g)(h) after considering the arrest and conviction record of the applicant and his current probation status (on probation until March 22, 2015).

The Commission also denied this request under administrative rule R 436.1105(2)(j) after considering the effects that issuance of a license would have on the health, welfare, and safety of the general public when determining whether an applicant should be issued a license or permit.

Kyle Bahri submitted a timely request for an appeal in this matter and Attorney James Miller represented the applicant at the October 20, 2015 hearing, held at the

Commission's Lansing office.

After hearing arguments, reviewing the MLCC file and updated documents submitted, and discussion of the issue on the record, the Commission finds that the applicant provided a copy of "Motion and Order for Discharge from Probation – Early" indicating Mr. Bahri was discharged early from probation on August 28, 2015. The Commission also finds that the applicant sufficiently answered all previous questions concerning this application.

Article IV, Section 40, of the Michigan Constitution (1963), permits the legislature to establish a Liquor Control Commission, which shall exercise complete control of the alcoholic beverage traffic within this state, including the retail sales thereof, subject to statutory limitations. MCL 436.1201(2) provides the Commission with the sole right, power, and duty to control the alcoholic beverage traffic and traffic in other alcoholic liquor within this state, including the manufacture, importation, possession, transportation and sale thereof.

The Commission finds sufficient reasons to reverse its denial issued in this matter and to approve the applicant's request for the reasons stated on the record.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

A. The denial order of March 18, 2015 issued in this matter is reversed and the applicant's request for a new Salesperson license is APPROVED.

B. Under administrative rule R 436.1003, the licensee shall comply with all state and local building, plumbing, zoning, sanitation, and health laws, rules, and ordinances as determined by the state and local law enforcements officials who have jurisdiction over the licensee. Approval of this license by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission does not waive any of these requirements. The licensee must obtain all other required state and local licenses, permits, and approvals before serving or selling alcoholic liquor.

C. Failure to comply with all requirements of licensure in the State of Michigan will result in the licensee being charged with a violation of the Michigan Liquor Control


Code, Administrative Rules, and Commission order, which may result in fines, suspension, and/or revocation of this license.
