SUMMARY: OH Rule 5001 General Requirements in Pulp, Paper and Paperboard Mills, is similar to 29 C.F.R. 1910.261 Pulp, paper, and paperboard mills, except for the following:

- General incorporation of standards
- Personal protective equipment
- Vessel entering
- Powered industrial trucks
- Illumination
- Contaminant control and ventilation
- Sanitary facilities
- Radiation

SUMMARY: OH Rule 5002 General Requirements in Textile Operations, is similar to 29 C.F.R. 1910.262 Textiles, except for the following:

- Housekeeping
- Lighting
- Ventilation
- First aid
- Personal protective equipment

Summary: OH Rule 5003 General Requirements in Bakery Equipment, is similar to 29 C.F.R. 1910.263 Bakery Equipment, except for the following:

- Standards incorporated by reference
- Ventilation

SUMMARY: OH Rule 5005 General Requirements in Sawmills; is similar to 29 C.F.R. 1910.265 Sawmills, except for the following:

- Application
- Incorporation of standards by reference
- Lighting
- Ventilation and contaminant control
- Powered industrial trucks
- Mechanical equipment
- Building facilities and isolated equipment
- Personal protective equipment
- Sanitation

SUMMARY: OH Rule 5006 General Requirements in Pulpwood Logging is similar to 29 C.F.R. 1910.266 Logging Operations, except for the following:

- Application
- Standards incorporated by reference
- Personal protective equipment
- Lighting
- First aid

OH Rule 5005 General Requirements In Sawmills	
<p>(1) General requirements. (a) Application. This rule includes safety requirements for sawmill operations including, but not limited to, log and lumber handling, sawing, trimming, and planing; waste disposal; operation of dry kilns; finishing; shipping; storage; yard and yard equipment; and for power tools and affiliated equipment used in connection with such operations, but excluding the manufacture of plywood, cooperage, and veneer.</p>	No comparable OSHA provisions.
<p>(b) Incorporation of standards by reference. Certain of the subsections of this rule incorporate and apply occupational safety and health standards of general application without regard to any specific industry. Such standards shall apply to sawmill operations in accordance with the rules of construction set forth in Rule 1106(3).</p>	No comparable OSHA provisions
<p>(c)****</p>	Equivalent
<p>(2) Lighting. For standards supplementing the general standards for illumination - see Rule 4106(4).</p>	No comparable OSHA provisions.
<p>(3) Ventilation and contaminant control. For ventilation and control standards supplementing the general standards - see Rule 3406.</p>	No comparable OSHA provisions.

OH Rule 5006 General Requirements In Pulpwood Logging	
<p>(1) Application.</p> <p>(a) General. This rule applies to pulpwood logging operations including but not limited to the operations of felling, limbing, marking, bucking, loading, skidding, prehauling and other operations associated with the preparation and movement of pulpwood timber from the stump to the point of delivery. The provisions of this rule do not apply to logging operations relating to sawlogs, veneer bolts, poles, piling and other forest products.</p>	No comparable OSHA provisions
<p>(b) Standards incorporated by reference. Standards covering issues of occupational health which are of general application without regard to any specific industry are incorporated by reference in subsections of this rule and made applicable to pulpwood logging. All such standards shall be construed according to the rules of construction set out in Rule 1106(3).</p>	No comparable OSHA provisions
<p>(2) Personal protection equipment. For standards supplementing the general standards for personal protection equipment - see Rule 3506.</p>	No comparable OSHA provisions.
(3) Lighting - pulpwood harvesting - see Rule 4106.	No comparable OSHA provisions.
(4) First aid. For specific information supplementing the general rules of first aid - see Rule 4401(5).	No comparable OSHA provisions.
