



## State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC)

Partnership Signing Date: February 23, 2015

The Christman Company, Daniels Building Company, the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) and partnering contractors entered into a formal partnership with the goal of enhanced safety and health protection, and zero worker injuries during the construction of the state's new State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC).

The new SEOC, which will be used by the state of Michigan to coordinate emergencies and disasters with local, state and federal agencies, is a \$22 million project consisting of a 27,000 square foot addition to the General Office Building located at 7150 Harris Drive in Dimondale. It will also include 37,000 square feet of renovations to two floors of the building adjacent to the new addition.



## Innovative Best Practices/Safety Initiatives

- A Job Hazard Analysis (JHA) is required for each shift and before any major elements of work are performed. The goal is to coordinate the efforts of all subcontractors, trades people and other project personnel to ensure the common safety of all involved.
- Give consideration to all safety factors during the planning and scheduling of work operations to control potential injury and property damage hazards. (Job Hazard Analysis or Pre-Task Analysis required.)
- Assume direct responsibility of not less than the minimum level of performance set forth in the Project Safety and Health Program, which means full compliance with the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Standards, and all applicable Federal, State and local regulations.
- Provide and enforce the use of all necessary personal protective equipment and immediately notify company representatives of any incident that causes damage to property, and conduct an immediate investigation with a written report.
- Report all near misses which could have potentially caused property damage or personal bodily injury.
