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### **Call to Order & Roll Call**

The May 26, 2011 MIOSHA OH Part 301/601 Air Contaminants Advisory Committee meeting was called to order by Co-Chair Timothy Kearney. A roll call was taken and a quorum was present. Committee members, staff, and guests introduced themselves.

### **Approval of Minutes from April 27, 2011**

The Advisory Committee reviewed the section of the minutes regarding Refractory Ceramic Fibers (RCF). It was determined that the minutes should reflect the recommended PEL of 0.5 f/cc TWA instead of 0.5 f/cm<sup>2</sup>. The committee also asked that “as defined in the NIOSH 7400 method” be removed from both motions regarding RCFs in the minutes.

The Advisory Committee determined that the discussion titled “Diesel Fuel Particulate” should be changed to Diesel Exhaust Particulate.

A motion was made by Jessie Simpson and seconded by Dennis Emery to accept the amended minutes of the April 27, 2011 Advisory Committee meeting. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

### **Further Discussion on Refractory Ceramic Fibers (RCFs)**

A motion was made by Robert Lieckfield and seconded by Cynthia Ostrowski that RCFs will be accessed using the NIOSH 7400 method for sampling the analysis and an RCF morphology as defined in the NIOSH criteria document for RCF. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

### **Approval of Final Draft of Air Contaminants Check Sheet**

The Advisory Committee reviewed the Air Contaminants Check Sheet and asked that the following changes be made:

- Add an \* next to air contaminants the committee determined needed further review by a separate advisory committee.
- Add 0.02 to both 301 and 601 Cobalt recommended exposure limits.
- Change column header from “Advisory Committee Recommended Exposure Limit” to “Advisory Committee Recommendation”

A motion was made by Cynthia Ostrowski and seconded by William Robert to accept the revised Air Contaminants Check Sheet. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

### **Election of Representatives to Bring Recommendations to the Occupational Health Standards Commission**

The committee determined that Co-Chairs Timothy Kearney and Dennis O’Brien will represent the advisory committee when recommendations are brought before the Occupational Health Standards Commission (OHSC). All members of the committee are welcome to attend the OHSC. MIOSHA Standards Staff will notify all 301/601 advisory committee members when a date is selected to present the advisory committee’s recommendations to the OHSC.
