With an astounding \$778.4 million transferred to the School Aid Fund. the Lottery shattered the previous record set in 2007. The Lottery's primary goal is to generate revenue for education. Since 1972, contributions have totaled more than \$17.3 billion.

Our sales topped the \$2.4 billion mark for the first time ever. Such a
