## FEATURED PRESENTERS

### Deputy Chief Steve Bellshaw

Deputy Chief Steve Bellshaw has worked for the Salem Police Department since 1989, and has supervised Salem Police Department's Criminal Investigation Division since 2007. The Investigation Division includes all detectives and addresses the areas of drug investigations, crime prevention, gangs, youth services, volunteers, and the crime lab.

Previously, Steve worked as a Patrol officer and as Detective working sex crimes and homicides. In 1998, he was promoted to Sergeant and served as the Youth Services Supervisor. While serving as the Internal Affairs Sergeant, he founded the CEASE Team and worked drug house and nuisance complaints.

Steve was promoted to Lieutenant in 2004 and has served as a Patrol Shift Commander and supervisor of the Drug Activity Response Team, Street Crimes Unit, and the Crime Prevention Unit. Other assignments have been to serve on the Marion County Domestic Violence Council, Child Abuse Review Team and the Marion County Sexual Assault Team. Steve currently co-chairs the Criminal Justice Committee of the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force, and serves as an instructor with the Sexual Assault Training Institute, training police officers statewide and nationally about sexual assault response and investigations. Additionally, Steve trains police officers nationwide for the International Association of Chiefs of Police.



### Detective Carrie Hull



Carrie Hull began her law enforcement career at the Portland Police Bureau before moving to Medford, Oregon in 2007 and joining the Ashland Police Department where she currently works as a Detective with a special emphasis on child abuse, child sexual abuse and adult sexual assault cases. Once in the detectives division, Carrie worked to change how the Ashland Police Department investigated sexual assault cases. The department now follows a victim-centered approach that has been very successful.

Carrie is a forensic interviewer of children, a participating member of the Jackson County Major Assault and Death Investigation Unit (MADIU) as well as the Jackson County Sexual Assault Response Team (JCSART) and the Jackson County Child Abuse Multi-disciplinary Team. She is a certified instructor in Verbal Judo, Self Defense Tactics for Women and Personal Protection Strategies for Women and Children.

Carrie created a sexual assault awareness program for 7th and 8th grade students that she teaches yearly to students along with advocates and other SART members. She is also the founder and administrator of the Southern Oregon Sexual Assault Symposium and the "I Will" sexual assault prevention campaign.
