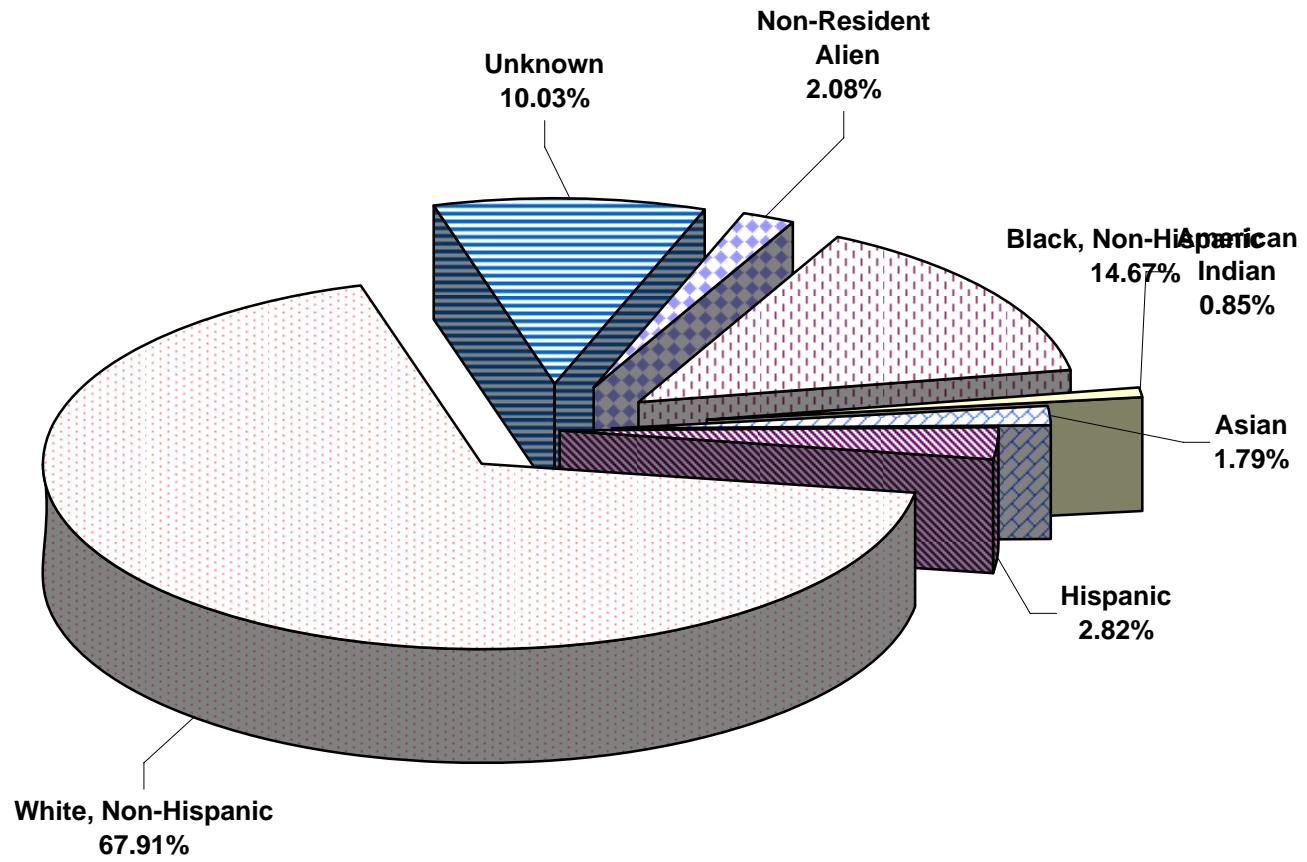

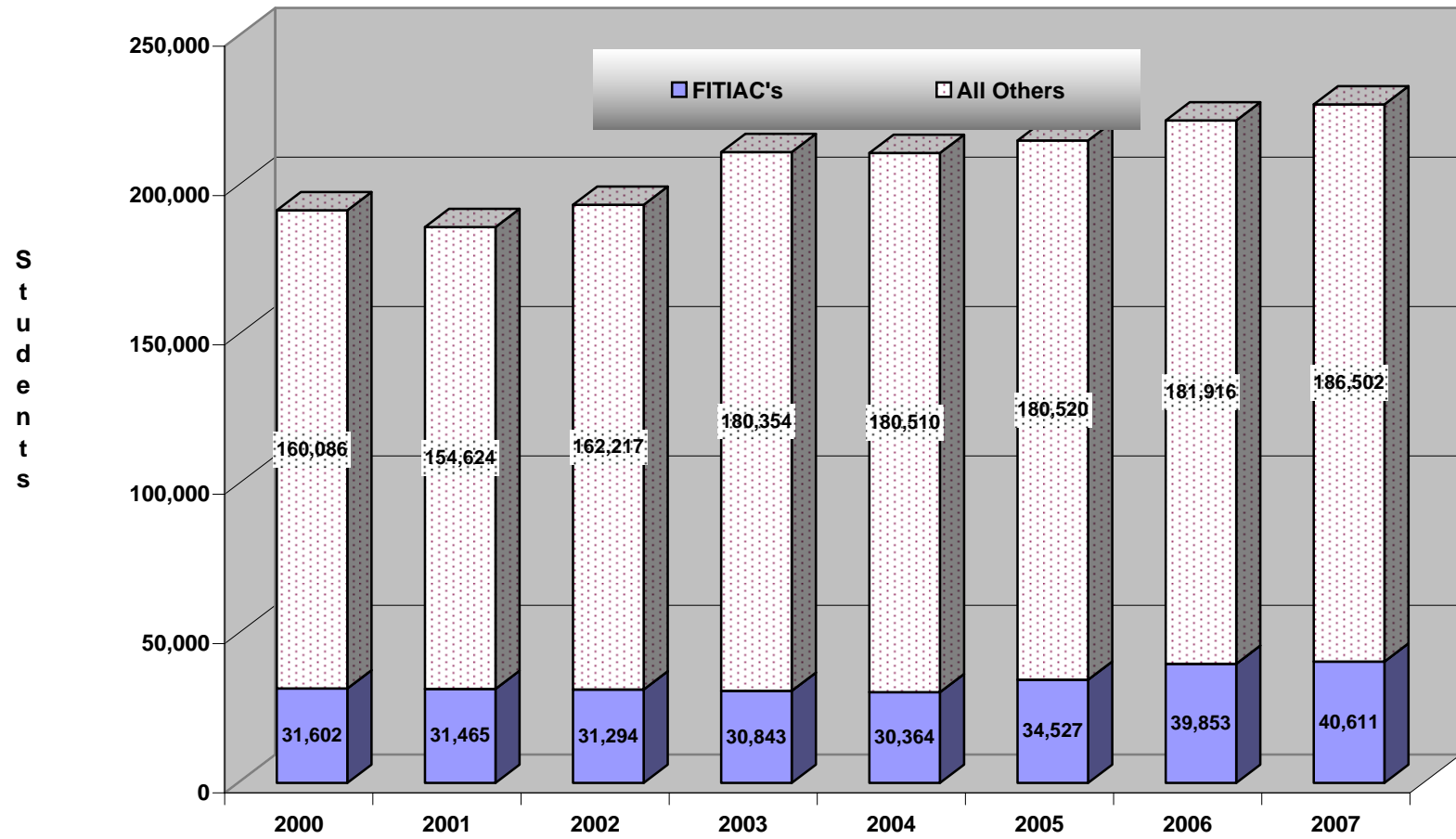

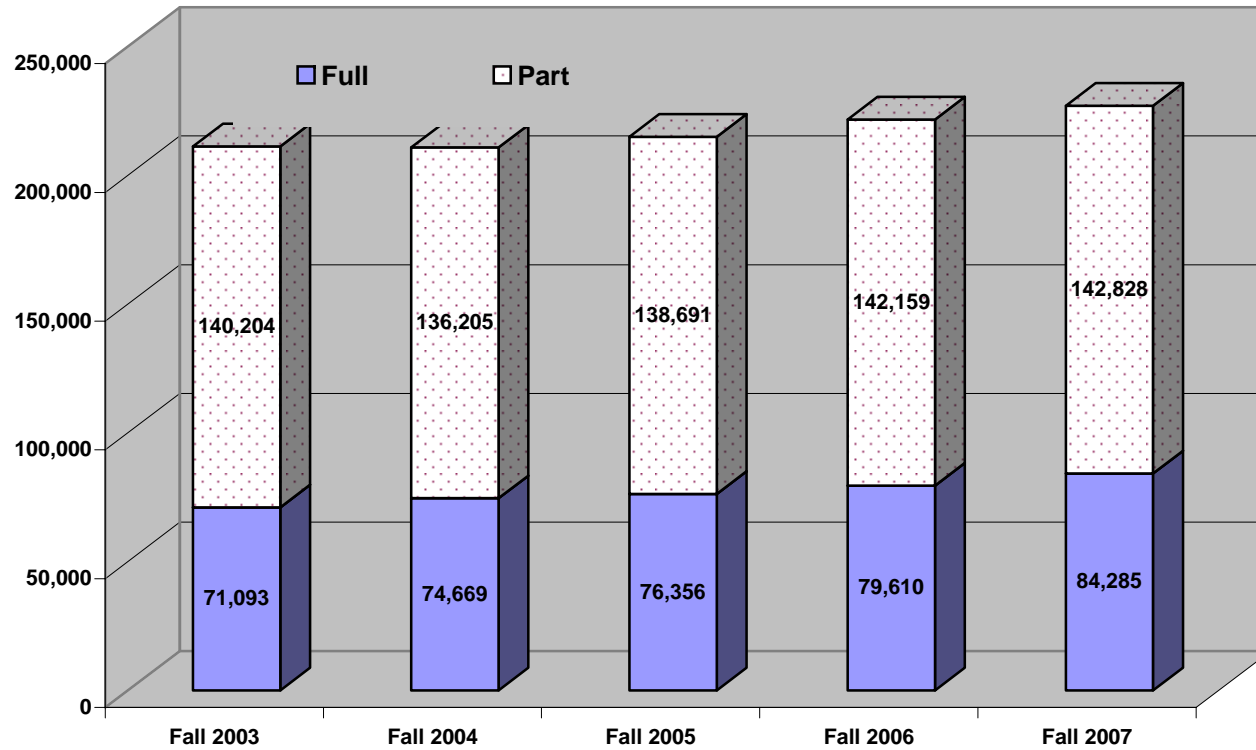

### Status of Fall Enrollment, Fall 2003 Through Fall 2007



*Full-Time enrollment has continuously increased since Fall 2003, exhibiting an overall increase of 18.6% since Fall 2003 and a 6% increase from Fall 2006 to Fall 2007. Part-Time enrollment has also increased, however, not as dramatically as full-time enrollment. Part-Time enrollment increased 1.9% since 2003 and the increase from 2006 to 2007 was less than 1%.*

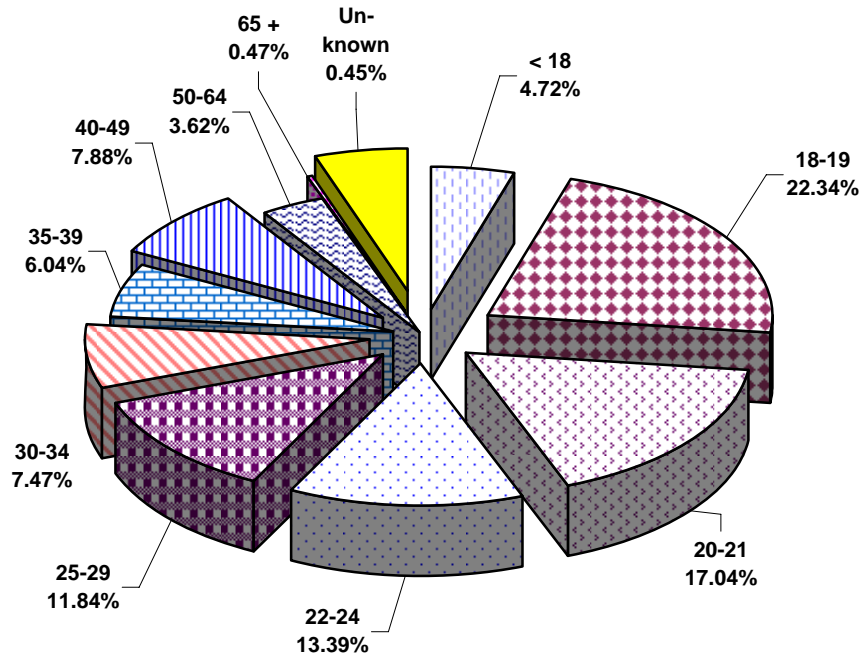

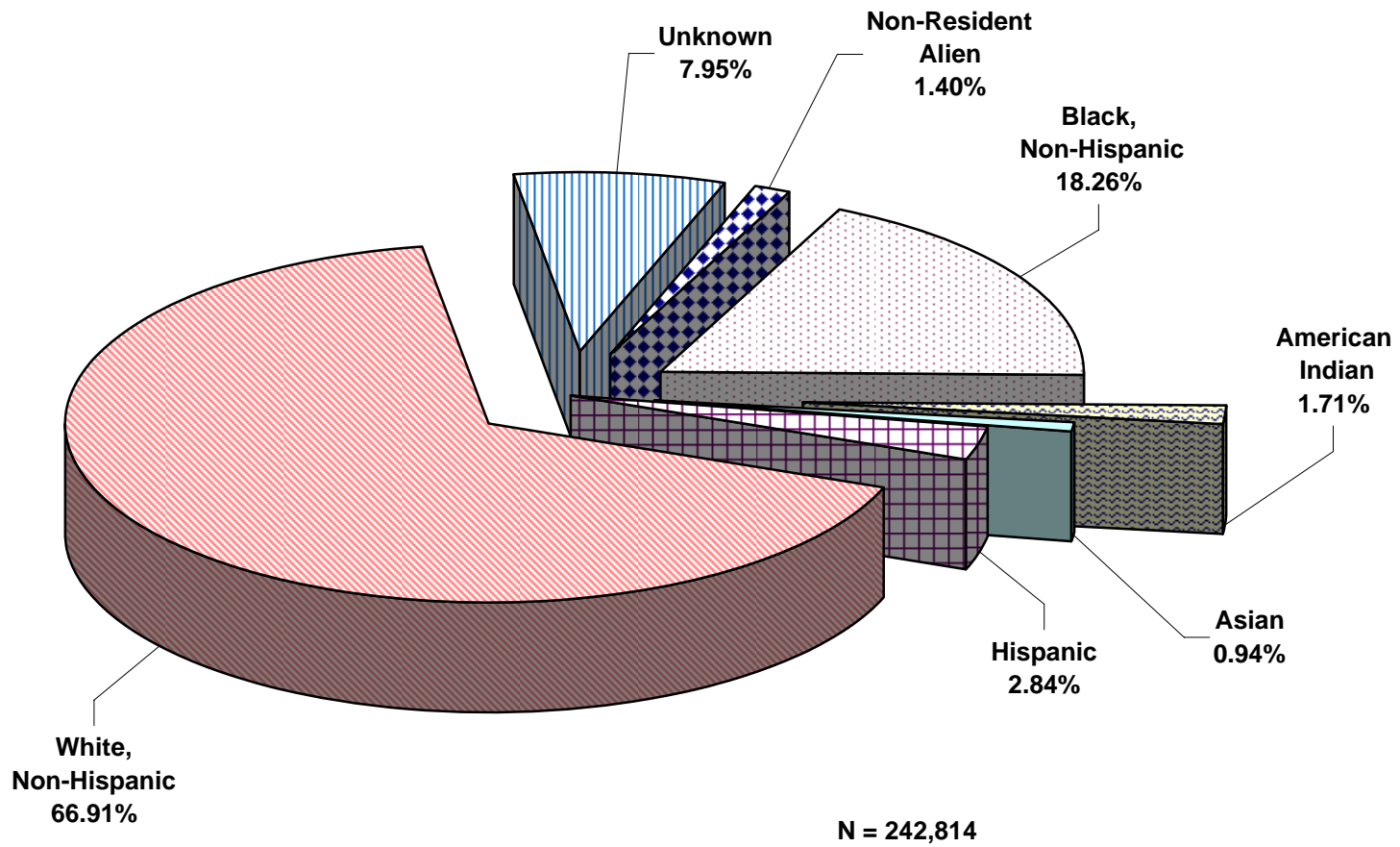

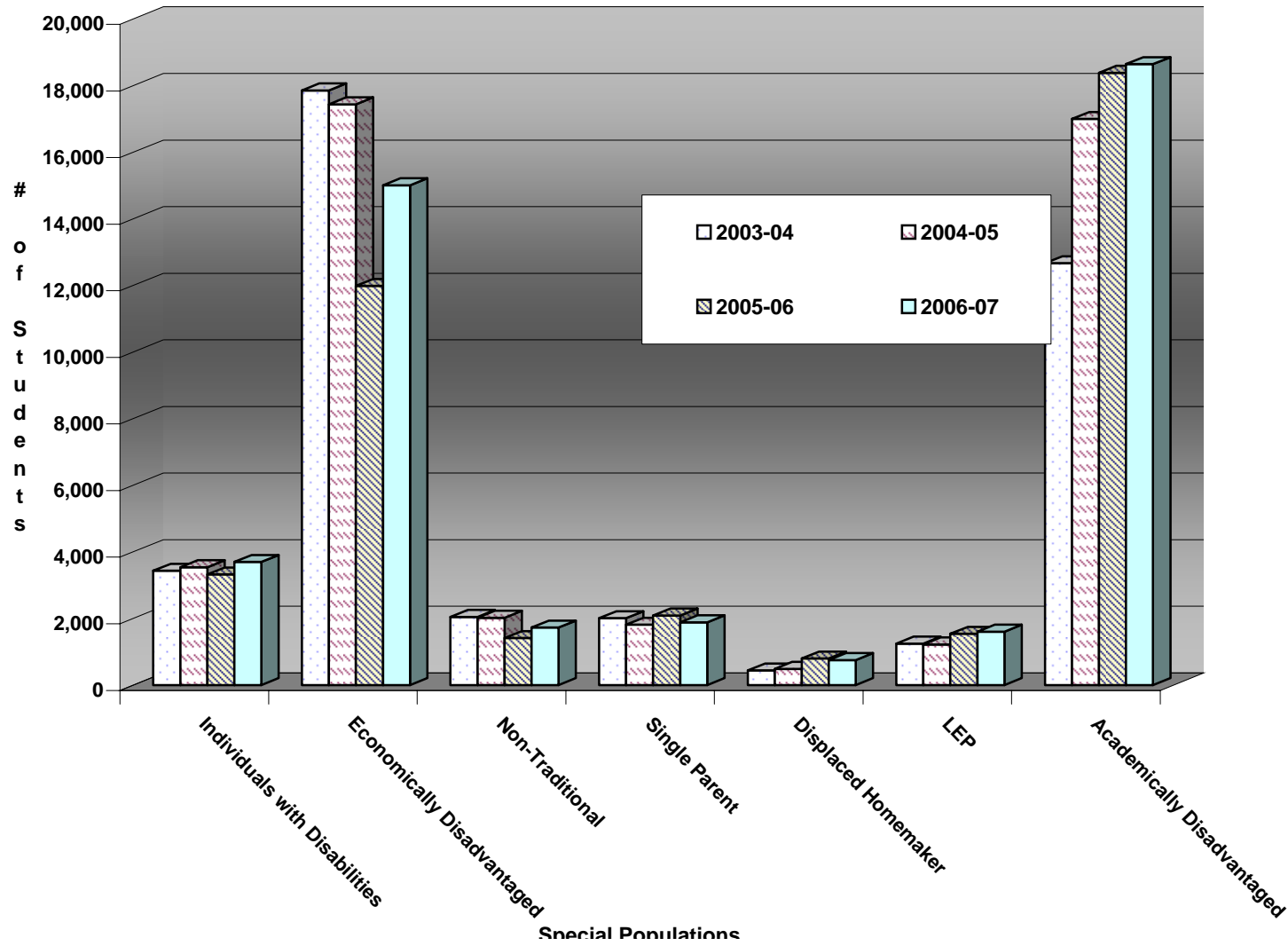

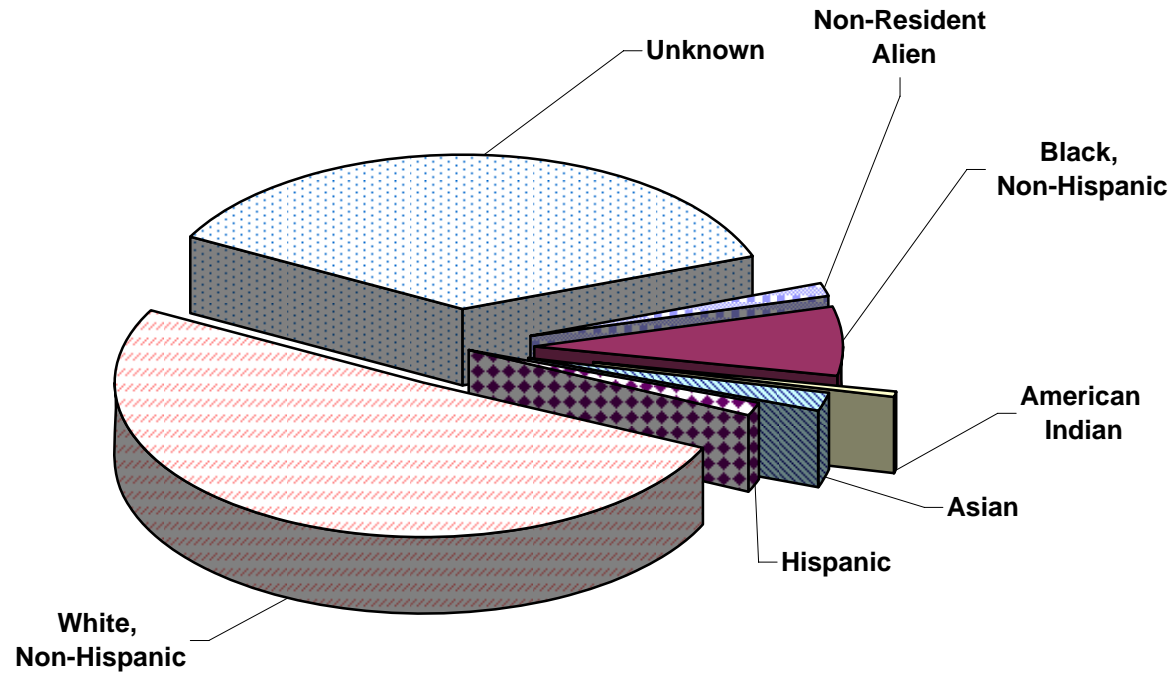

# TOTAL YEAR-END ENROLLMENTS BY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, 2002-03 Through 2006-07

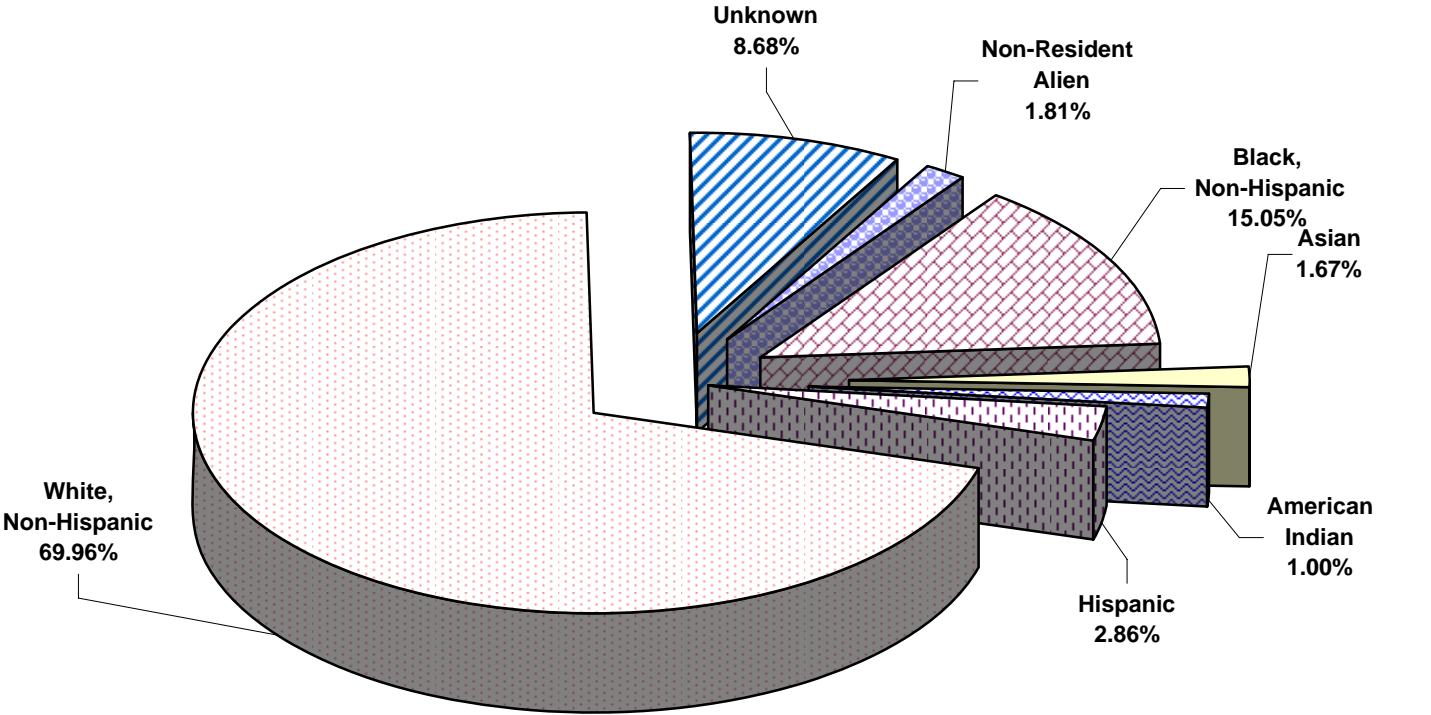

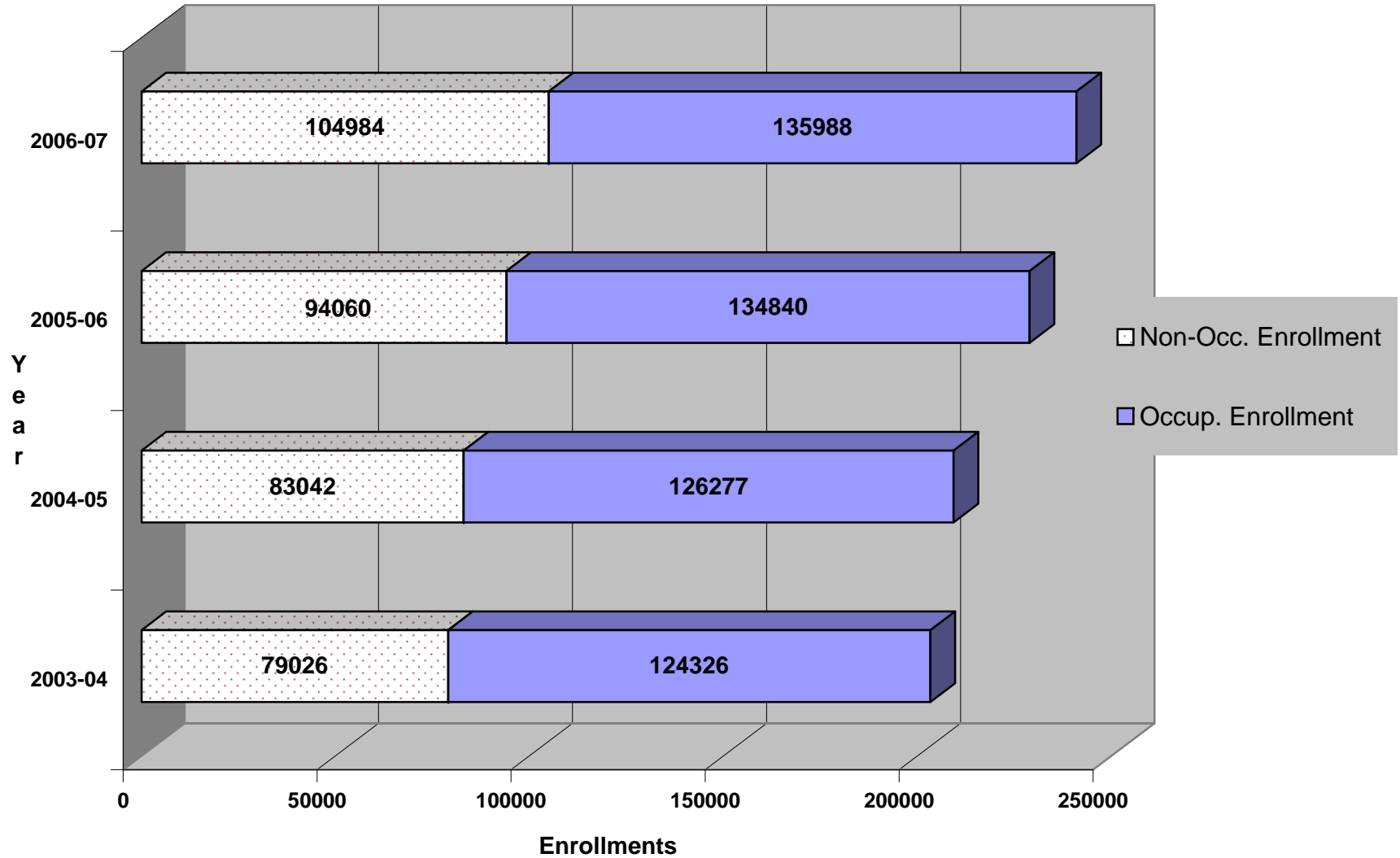

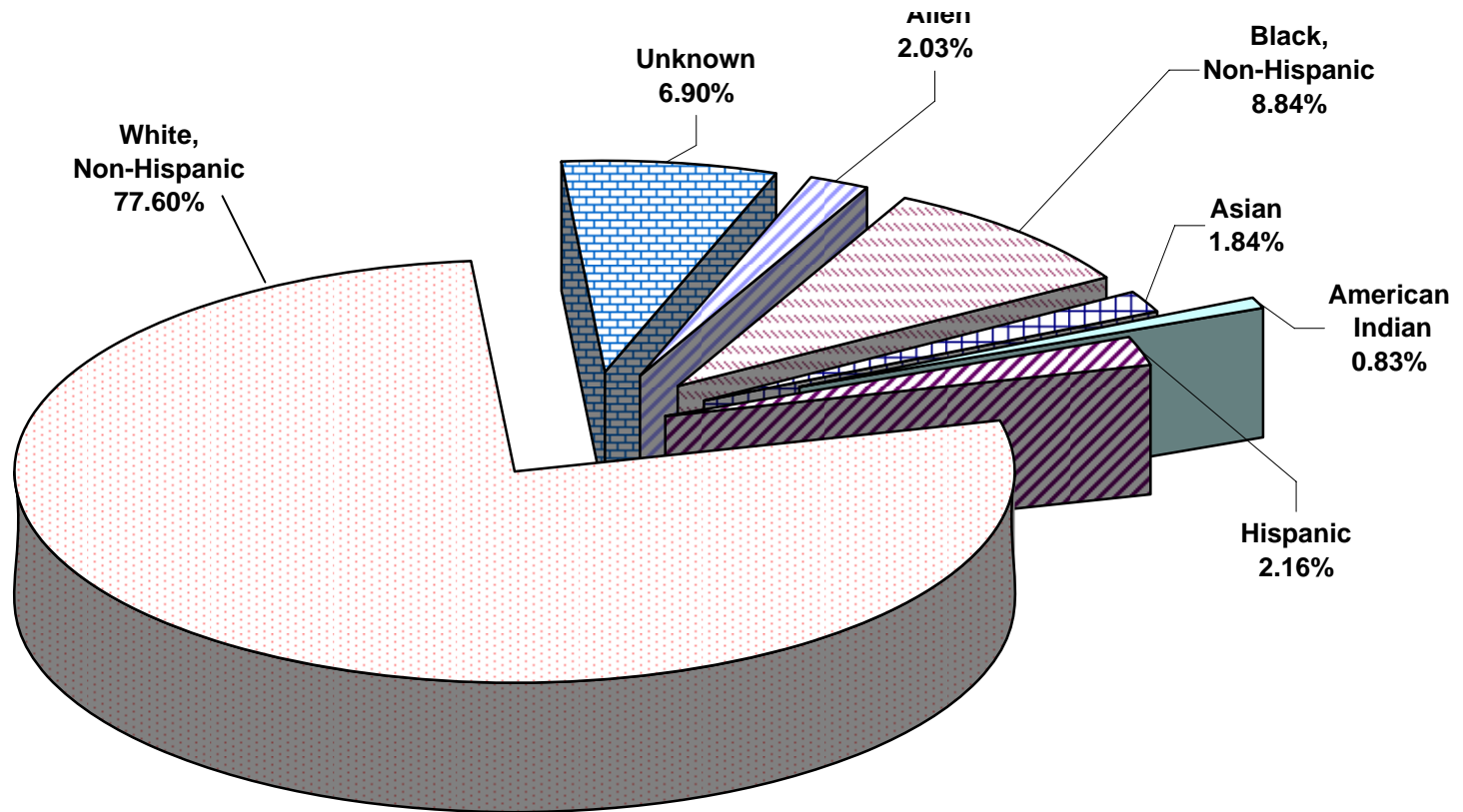
**OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS AS COMPARED TO

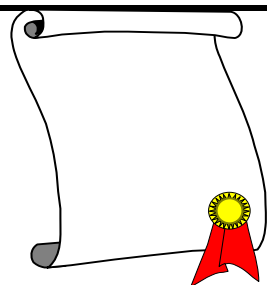

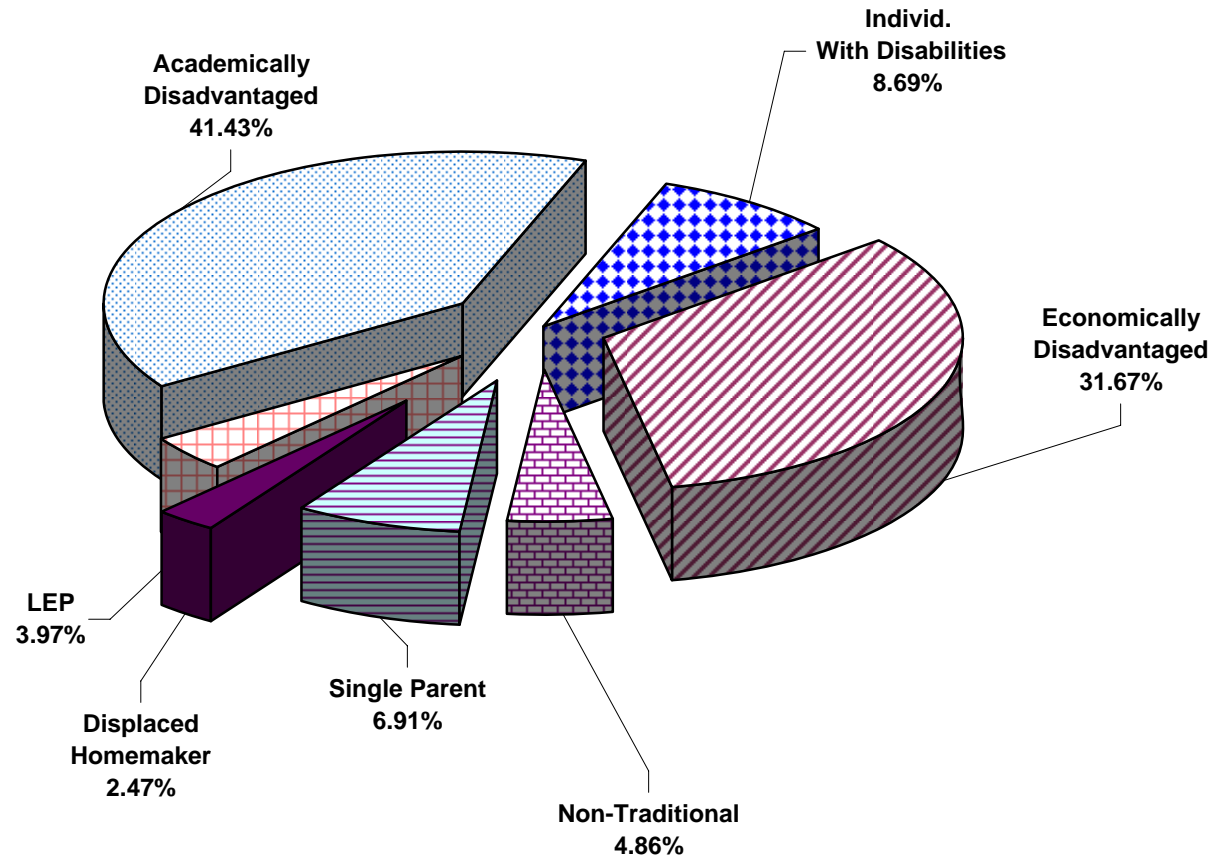

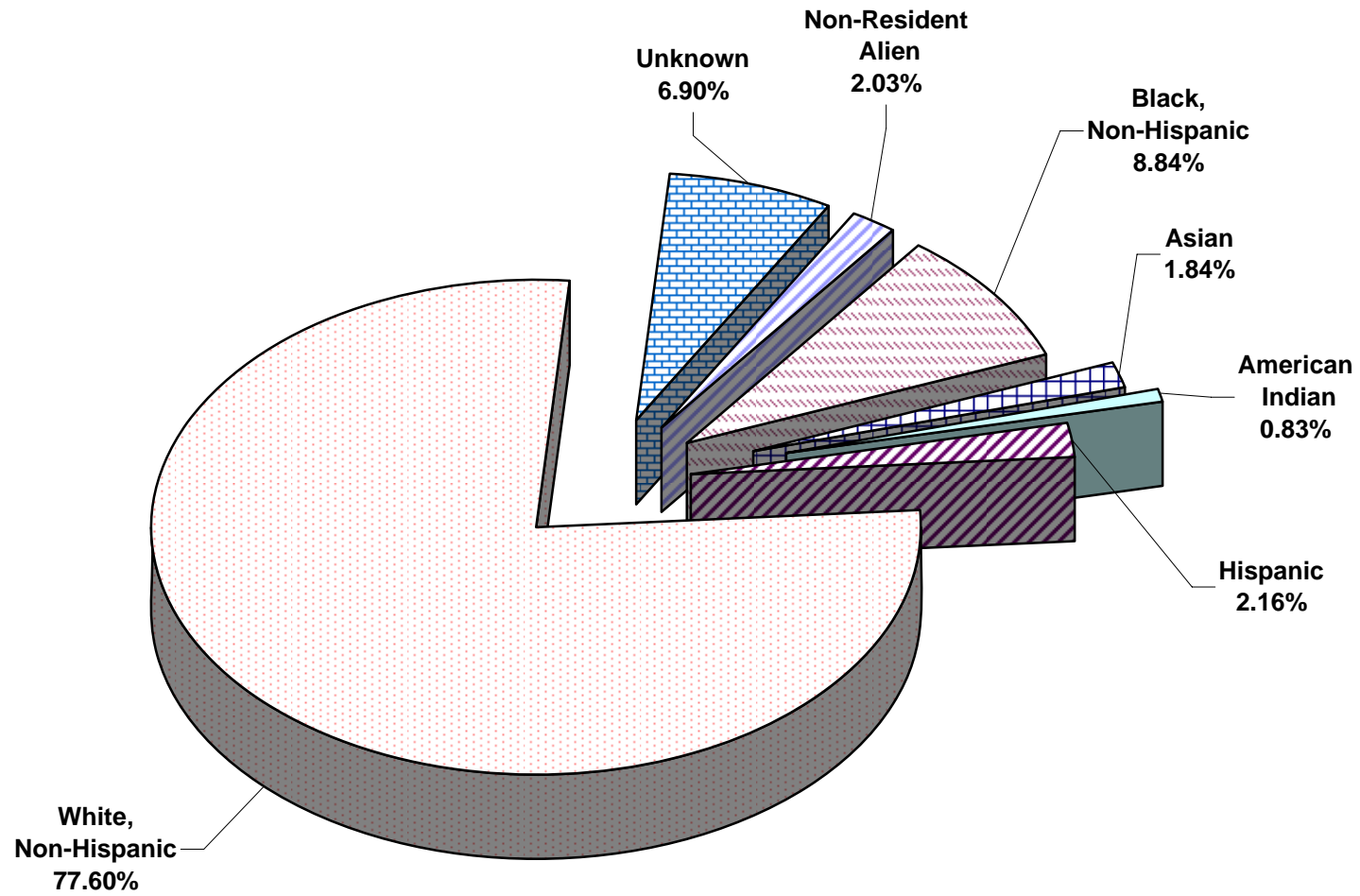
