The Rebuild Michigan Program is designed to assist public (K-12) schools, colleges, universities, local governments, small business, libraries, churches, and public housing authorities to identify cost effective energy conservation options for their building(s). As a Rebuild Community Client, you are entitled to a complimentary Introductory Energy Evaluation (IEE) walk-through audit, which will be performed by a MEO energy auditor or by one of our qualified Regional Technical Assistants. Please refer to the [Regional Technical Assistants Map](#) to find a qualified Regional Technical Assistant in your area.

The IEE will then be used to develop a site-specific energy action plan, which will map out the energy future for a facility or community and how it can be achieved. As a Rebuild Michigan Community Client, you will receive the following benefits:

- Utility bill analysis and energy consumption profile for each building
- Free walk-through energy analysis and Introductory Energy Evaluation (IEE) report
- Sample IEE Report for a school district
- Sample IEE Report for a local government
- EnergyStar benchmarking for eligible buildings
- Listing of energy consultants to conduct technical energy analyses
- Quality review of each completed technical energy analysis report
- Low cost project financing through the Michigan Municipal Bond Authority to purchase energy efficiency improvements
- A repayment schedule structured around the project's energy savings rate
- Project monitoring and troubleshooting
- Qualify to obtain subsidized energy/facility training through MEO

## Building Operator Certification Rebate Program

---

The Building Operator Certification (BOC) Program is expanding training opportunities in Michigan during 2013. The BOC training course equips its graduates with the knowledge and skills to save energy, reduce operating costs, and improve the overall efficiency and comfort of their facilities.

The Michigan Energy Office (MEO), in conjunction with other BOC sponsors, will be offering tuition rebates (up to \$350), in the form of direct voucher payments, to operators that successfully complete training and receive certification through the Mid-West Energy Efficiency Alliance (MEEA) BOC program.

Only those building operators whose facilities have participated in the MEO's Rebuild Michigan program or who have enrolled their buildings in the Rebuild Michigan program are eligible for the rebate.
