*Data source: Michigan Disease Surveillance System (MDSS) aggregate reports of influenza-like illness and individual case reports of influenza (including 2009 influenza A (H1N1)).

**The data in this report are provisional, based on current reports to MDCH by local health departments. The MDSS is a dynamic, continually active system: counts of disease are constantly changing as cases are investigated, confirmed as cases, or ruled out as not meeting the case definition. This report reflects this constant activity as the numbers slightly fluctuate each week. Therefore, it should be kept in mind that numbers in this report are NOT final and should be used only to generally monitor trends over time.
