

# MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR SPECIAL POPULATIONS

(FY2013 Appropriation Bill - Public Act 200 of 2012)

**January 1, 2013**

**Section 403.** (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for mental health services for special populations, the department shall ensure that CMHSPs or PIHPs meet with multicultural service providers to develop a workable framework for contracting, service delivery, and reimbursement. (2) Funds appropriated in part 1 for mental health services for special populations shall not be utilized for services provided to illegal immigrants, fugitive felons, and individuals who are not residents of this state. The department shall maintain contracts with recipients of multicultural services grants that mandate grantees establish that recipients of services are legally residing in the United States. An exception to the contractual provision shall be allowed to address individuals presenting with emergent mental health conditions. (3) The department shall require an annual report from the independent organizations that receive mental health services for special populations funding. The annual report, due January 1 of the current fiscal year, shall include specific information on services and programs provided, the client base to which the services and programs were provided, information on any wraparound services provided, and the expenditures for those services. The department shall provide the annual reports to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on community health and the senate and house fiscal agencies.

## MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR SPECIAL POPULATIONS

The fiscal year 2012 appropriations for Mental Health Services for Special Populations consisted of an on-going general fund/general purpose appropriation of \$5,842,800 and a one-time general fund/general purpose appropriation of \$3,000,000, for total available funding of \$8,842,800. Of this amount, a total of \$8,759,028 was expended through partnerships entered into by the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) and various organizations that help serve special populations within Michigan. These partnerships included contracts with the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit, the Chaldean Community Foundation, and the Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, for expenditures totaling \$3,313,172. The remaining expenditures included \$5,195,856 through contracts with thirteen Community Mental Health Services Programs (CMHSPs), and \$250,000 through services provided by the Michigan Department of Civil Rights. The information below further summarizes these expenditures and the services provided.

### **Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit – Total Expenditures: \$1,995,741**

MDCH allocated \$1,995,741 in both on-going (\$1,295,741) and one-time (\$700,000) fiscal year 2012 funding to the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit. This organization subcontracted for a variety of services encompassing the provision of case management, mental health counseling, psychiatric evaluations, transportation, and translation services for 4,821 clients. Other services included specialized programming for aging adults with developmental disabilities; therapeutic home visits and summer programs for children with disabilities and their families; group programs for children with disabilities; mental health support group meetings for Holocaust survivors; and nursing and medical support services. Additionally, this program provided special support services for older workers to help them develop a life/work plan in order to facilitate successful employment outcomes or develop a viable retirement plan. The federation also provided medical monitoring and support services to individuals with significant physical disabilities, medical conditions, chronic mental illness and/or severe developmental disabilities.

### **Chaldean Community Foundation – Total Expenditures: \$1,118,853**

The contract with the Chaldean Community Foundation included a total of \$1,118,853 in both on-going (\$468,853) and one-time (\$650,000) fiscal year 2012 funding.<sup>i</sup> The Chaldean Community Foundation partnered with the St. John Health System - Eastwood Clinics, Chaldean Federation of America, Chaldean American Association of Health Professionals, Chaldean American Bar Association, and Macomb Community College to provide Refugee Mental Health and Acculturation Services. Services provided included comprehensive, community-based mental health services, helping refugees assimilate and create long-term job placement, English as a second language, identifying permanent housing solutions, raising awareness of mental health issues, transportation, and coordinating program services. A total of 2,428 clients were served during the fiscal year.

### **Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan – Total Expenditures: \$198,578**

Expenditures by the Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc. totaled \$198,578 in on-going fiscal year 2012 funding.<sup>ii</sup> These resources provided financial support to seven federally

recognized tribes by facilitating the provision of mental health services in an ethnically sensitive manner based on their cultural needs for 1,693 clients during the fiscal year. The project supported reservation-based mental health workers and clinicians who provided a broad range of services, including Talking Circles with Elders, outreach/prevention services, education sessions, chronic disease social support groups, counseling/therapeutic services, and training of provider staff.

**CMHSPs and Department of Civil Rights – Total Expenditures: \$5,445,856**

Contracts with thirteen CMHSPs and a partnership with the Michigan Department of Civil Rights resulted in expenditures totaling \$5,445,856 from both on-going (\$3,795,856) and one-time (\$1,650,000) fiscal year 2012 funding. These resources supported behavioral health services for the following populations: Arab, Asian, Chaldean, Chinese, Hispanic, Jewish, Native American, and Vietnam Veterans. The specific annual expenditure amounts for the CMHSPs and the Department of Civil Rights for services provided to these populations, as well as expenditures for the direct contracts discussed above, can be viewed in attachments A and B in terms of expenditures from both the on-going and one-time general fund/general purpose appropriations.
