What is Care Coordination?

Care coordination is:

"A needs driven, team-based process that values families as essential partners."

Care coordination is intended to integrate care among multiple service providers, enhance the caregiving ability of the family, and maximize the potential of the child".

Children's Special Health Care Services and the Family Center for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs is partnering with Region 4 Midwest Genetics Collaborative to offer a training for parents of children with special health care needs. The purpose of the training is to help parents learn:

- How to identify a medical home
- Techniques to organize information and find reliable resources
- How to navigate health care and insurance systems
- Skills to increase communication and coordination between multiple providers
- How to plan early for child's transition
- Ideas for coping with stress and finding support
- Advocacy skills

This training is open to any parent of a child (birth-21) who has special health care needs.
