



Since you currently live in one of the counties where MI Health Link will be offered, you may be eligible if you:

- Are age 21 or older
- Have full Medicare and full Medicaid
- Are not enrolled in Hospice

MI Health Link benefits:

- Medical services
- Medications (No Co-payments)
- Dental services
- Vision services
- In-home services
- Community mental health services
- Community-based services
- Equipment to help with activities of daily living

Information about a new program that can simplify the way you get your Medicare and Medicaid services

You are getting this letter because you have both Medicare and Medicaid. A new healthcare option called MI Health Link is available in your area. MI Health Link will allow you to use one card to get health care, behavioral health care, home and community-based services, nursing home care and medications through one health plan. You will have your choice of doctors and other providers within your health plan's network who will work together to give you the care you want and need.

If you choose to join a MI Health Link health plan, you will have your own Care Coordinator who will help link you to your doctors, pharmacies, behavioral health care and long term care supports and services through your health plan. The Care Coordinator will also help make sure that all your doctors and other providers work together to meet your needs and honor your choices. This person will assist with your care plan, answer your questions, help get appointments and services, arrange transportation, and more.

Your choices:

- You may choose to join MI Health Link to begin receiving services as early as <Start Date>
- You may do nothing and be enrolled into MI Health Link at a later date (you would receive letters first)
- You may join or opt-out of MI Health Link at any time

What should I consider?

- If you have Medicare health or drug coverage from an employer or union sponsored plan, you can leave that coverage and enroll in MI Health Link. **However, you or your dependents could lose that employer or union coverage completely and not get it back if you join MI Health Link.** Contact your benefits administrator if you have questions about your current coverage.
- If you are currently enrolled in **MI Choice**, you can stay in the MI Choice program or leave MI Choice to enroll in MI Health Link. However, if you join MI Health Link and later decide you want to return to MI Choice, you may have to go on a waiting list until the program has another opening.



- If you are currently enrolled in **PACE**, you can stay in PACE or leave PACE to enroll in MI Health Link. However, if you join MI Health Link and later decide you want to return to PACE, you can re-enroll if there is an opening and you continue to meet the PACE enrollment requirements.

What should I do now?

- Talk about your choices with someone who knows about your health care needs, like your family, allies, or someone at your local Michigan Medicare/Medicaid Assistance Program (MMAP) office. MMAP can help you know if your providers participate and if your drugs are covered.
- Ask your doctors and other providers if they are participating with a MI Health Link health plan.
- Go to www.michigan.gov/MIHealthLink to learn more about MI Health Link.
- Make a choice to join or opt-out of MI Health Link.

Who should I call if I have questions?

- Call the Michigan Medicare/Medicaid Assistance Program (MMAP) office to talk about your health care options. MMAP can be reached Monday through Friday from 8AM – 5PM ET at 1-800-803-7174. This call is free.
- If you live in a nursing home, adult foster care home or a home for aged, you may call the Michigan Long Term Care Ombudsman at 1-866-485-9393 for help.
- If you have questions about your Medicare eligibility, your Medicare prescription drug plan, Medicare Advantage, or other Medicare questions, call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227). TTY users should call 1-877-486-2048. They are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You can also visit www.medicare.gov.
- Call Michigan ENROLLS to enroll or opt out of MI Health Link, toll-free at 1-800-975-7630. Persons with hearing and speech disabilities may call the TTY number at 1-888-263-5897. The office hours are Monday through Friday 8 AM to 7 PM ET.
