

# FASD PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION GRANT

- **Goals: (1) Pregnant women will reduce their alcohol consumption by 50% during pregnancy. (2) 70% of non-pregnant women of child bearing age will indicate use of birth control.**

# Project CHOICES – CARE, Macomb County

- **Goal:** Decrease the incidence of alcohol exposed pregnancies. Project CHOICES, an evidenced base approach, will be delivered at Butcher Community High School where CARE provides an on-site student assistance case manager.
- **Relationship to existing program:** Young women participating in Project CHOICES who have children with prenatal exposure to alcohol are eligible to enroll in Project FASD ACHIEVE – a CARE FASD diagnostic and intervention initiative.

## Therapeutic Horseback Riding

- **Goal: Reduce secondary disabilities associated with FASD through therapeutic horseback riding**
- **Program:**
  - Provides 6-week individualized therapeutic riding intervention for 6 to 8 students with an FASD diagnosis
  - Provides concurrent group support for parents of students participating in intervention

- **Goal: The Guidance Center's FASAware project will pre-screen infants and young children at risk for FASD and provide referrals for services that will measurably improve their functioning.**

# FASD Social Skills Training

- Key goal of the pilot program: Enhance the overall social functioning of a child with an FASD to further improve longer term outcomes (serve as a protective measure against secondary disabilities).
- Relationship to existing program: Spectrum Health provides diagnostic evaluations for FASDs. Most of the children in the program are patients from the Prenatal Alcohol Exposure clinic.
