RE: FY 2010 FASD Prevention and Intervention Funding Allocation For Local  
Community Projects

The Michigan Department of Community Health is pleased to invite FY 2009 Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Local Prevention and Intervention Grant awardees to apply for non-competitive FY 2010, Option Year One grants. The FY 2010 allocation is to provide local agencies funding for the *Implementation Phase* of their approved community projects and is intended to provide direct service for the prevention of alcohol exposed pregnancies and/or diagnosis and intervention for children with FASD. No local match is required for this Option Year One grant, but is recommended to improve sustainability of efforts when the grant is concluded on September 30, 2010. The maximum funding allocation for FY 2010 will be \$9,520 for each grant awardee. The reduction in funding from the original amount of \$10,000, stated in the FY2009 Request for Proposal for Option Year One, is necessary to balance allocations with the estimated total amount of funding available for FASD statewide.

Grantees who wish to apply for the non-competitive, FY 2010, Option Year One FASD funding must submit the following:

- Official agency *Letter For FASD Funding Request FY 2010, Option Year One*, that contains an electronic signature of the Project Director and Financial Officer of the agency.
- The total amount of funding requested by the agency, not to exceed \$9,520.
- A budget detailing expenditures and revenue. For local health department grantees, please use appropriate budget forms identified in your Comprehensive Planning and Budgeting Contract (CPBC) with the State of Michigan.
- The *Letter for FASD Funding Request FY 2010, Option Year One*, **must be received no later than Monday, September 14, 2009 at 5:00 pm.**

***If the letter for funding request is received after this date and time, the agency's request will not be considered or reviewed. Letters for funding that are submitted, but without required signatures, will not be accepted and will be returned to the applicant *without review*.***
