**CHILD & ADOLESCENT HEALTH CENTER REPORT
JANUARY 1, 2011 - SEPTEMBER 30, 2011**

BACKGROUND:

This report summarizes the activities and funding sources of the 61 clinical Child & Adolescent Health Centers (CAHCs) which received state funding during calendar year (CY) 2011 from January 1, 2011 to September 30, 2011 **ONLY**. *The MDCH CAHC program reporting process changed this year from a calendar year to fiscal year reporting period, thus this report contains only three quarters of data.* Fifty-one of the CAHCs are school-based (located within a school building) and ten are community-based (locations easily accessible to teens). The clinical health center model provides on-site comprehensive primary health care, behavioral health services, health promotion/disease prevention education, and referral services to children 5-10 years of age or youth 10-21 years of age. Over the past decade, the number of clinical health centers receiving state funding has doubled due to the State's ability to access federal matching resources. This expansion has resulted in an unprecedented number of children and youth served by this critical safety net program.

This report also summarizes data based on services provided by the nine non-clinical adolescent health centers. Non-clinical centers provide health services based on the needs of teens in their local jurisdiction. They deliver a variety of services, including limited clinical care, mental health services, individual health screening, case finding and referral, as well as health education and risk reduction information.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS:

Key highlights noted in review of the calendar year 2011 (January 1 through September 30, 2011) data are as follows:

- **Due to a change in MDCH CAHC data reporting requirements from a calendar year to fiscal year reporting period, the numbers reported in this report will be smaller due to the omission of one quarter of data (Oct-Dec). This quarter of data will be reflected in the 2012 Legislative Report submitted by the MDCH CAHC program.**
- The total number of children and adolescents receiving services through the 61 clinical health centers was 29,777.
- The total number of all health services provided to children and adolescents in clinical centers was 116,140.
- Clinical health centers provided 10,934 immunizations and 38,823 general medical services to at-risk kids in Michigan.
- CAHCs enrolled 2,246 children and families in Medicaid and provided over 685,000 Medicaid outreach and public awareness activities to eligible families in Michigan.
- Over 28,306 youth received individual risk reduction and health promotion services.
- Approximately 57% of services were provided to youth of color during 2011. Forty percent of children and youth that received services in the clinical health centers were African-American.
- Males comprised approximately 43% of the total users.
- Youth under 15 years of age represented 53% of all users, with 15,630 teens/children under 15 receiving services.
- Approximately 239,089 children and adolescents received health information and education in 3,380 sessions conducted by clinical child & adolescent health center staff.
- The nine non-clinical adolescent health center sites provided a total of 1,602 educational sessions, reaching 20,443 teens.
- The non-clinical health centers provided 4,847 services and 634 referrals to youth from January 1, 2011 through September 30, 2011.







Adolescent Health Services
Definitions of Service and Referral Categories**

The following definitions of the service/referral categories are meant to be all encompassing and mutually exclusive and should apply to all services provided or referrals made. Individual or small group education may include groups of up to ten persons for specific education, treatment, or therapy. Small groups are recorded here only when persons have been diagnosed, referred for follow-up, and are being individually charted and reported for this service.

- (a) Chronic Disease Management is the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and maintenance of chronic conditions such as hypertension, diabetes, sickle cell anemia, scoliosis, asthma, cystic fibrosis, irreversible heart murmur, allergies, and irreversible skin anomalies. (Diet instruction related to and part of treatment for chronic conditions/diseases should be included here.)
- (b) Family Planning* are those medical, nursing, social, and educational activities which enable individuals to exercise informed choice in fulfilling their personal childbearing objectives.
- (c) Health Promotion and Risk Reduction are activities undertaken for the purpose of reducing risks including health risk appraisals, behavior modification, and education programs for smoking cessation, proper exercise, stress management, and accident prevention. (Healthful diet instruction for risk reduction purposes should be included here, including weight management and weight loss if not related to a chronic or acute condition.)
- (d) Immunization services entail the assessment and provision of appropriate vaccines for age.
- (e) Mental Health Services and Counseling encompasses services designed to facilitate the best possible psychological and emotional well-being of adolescents.
- (f) Prenatal and Postpartum Care includes those medical, nursing, social, and education services provided to pregnant and postpartum adolescents, including prepared childbirth/expectant parent classes and diet instruction.
- (g) STD Diagnosis and Treatment/HIV encompasses those medical, nursing, social, and educational services for adolescents tested for, having or suspected of having a sexually transmitted disease/infection and/or HIV/AIDS.
- (h) Substance Abuse Diagnosis and Treatment includes diagnosis, counseling, detoxification, custodial care, supportive and ancillary services for rehabilitation and follow-up counseling after discharge from a program.
- (i) General Medical encompasses those services provided which do not fall into the other categories such as diagnosis and treatment of minor, acute illness and injuries, gynecological examinations, etc.
- (j) Medicaid Outreach includes any activities that assist an individual to become eligible for Medicaid, including assistance w/completing forms, following up to ensure that the application was completed and submitted, and then following up to on status of application.
- (k) Vision and Hearing includes age and developmentally appropriate screening, evaluation and/or assessment of visual and auditory acuity by trained personnel using acceptable subjective and/or objective methods. Assessment of risk factors that place youth at increased risk for visual or auditory loss, vision and hearing history, observation and visual inspection may be included as part of the evaluation/assessment.
- (l) Preventative Screening includes clinical preventive services that address developmental and psychosocial aspects of health in addition to biomedical conditions. The comprehensive physical exam may include components such as height and weight/BMI, blood pressure (ages 3 and up), nutritional assessments and appropriate laboratory procedures as well as health history/screening and health guidance activities.

**State law prohibits prescribing, dispensing or distributing contraceptives on school property. If a family planning service is reported by a school-based teen health center, it refers to either an examination or follow-up visit.*

DEFINITIONS OF EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION CATEGORIES

The following definitions have been used to describe all large group/class educational sessions provided.

- (a) Chronic Disease Education includes information regarding prevention, symptom recognition, and management of chronic conditions such as hypertension, diabetes, sickle cell anemia, scoliosis, asthma, cystic fibrosis, irreversible heart murmur, allergies, and irreversible skin anomalies.
- (b) Family Planning/Reproductive Health Education includes information regarding sexuality development and family planning which enables individuals to exercise choice in fulfilling personal childbearing objectives.*
- (c) Health Promotion and Risk Reduction Education includes information on reducing risks of health problems and developing healthy behaviors which limit the incidence of disease and injuries. It may also include information on adolescent health resources and utilization of health systems.
- (d) Immunization Education includes information on the importance of receiving primary immunization and maintaining a positive immunization status.
- (e) Mental Health Education includes topics designed to facilitate the best possible psychological and emotional well-being of adolescents. Examples include general information on development of positive self-esteem, stress/anger management, suicide prevention, family and peer interactions.
- (f) Prenatal and Postpartum Care Education includes information provided to pregnant and postpartum adolescents.
- (g) STD and HIV Prevention Education includes information regarding the prevention and management of sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV and AIDS.
- (h) Substance Abuse Prevention Education includes information about drug abuse prevention, treatment, and counseling.
- (i) General Medical Education includes information regarding a variety of diseases and injuries which do not logically fall into other listed categories.
- (j) Medicaid Outreach Information includes informing eligible or potentially eligible individuals about Medicaid and how to access Medicaid programs, describing services covered under Medicaid, and information on how to obtain Medicaid preventative services

* Sessions provided in schools require compliance with the School Code Sections 1506 and 1507.
