SE-4096 Supplemental Page - Update

- Jeff and Liz will continue to work with MDE to implement the publication of the SE-4096 supplemental page 5

National Provider Identifier Update

- All SBS providers have obtained and reported their NPI numbers to MDCH
- MDCH contingency plan for NPI implementation in effect until 9/30/07
 - More detailed information regarding the NPI is available on the MDCH website: www.michigan.gov/mdch
 - MDCH will implement a contingency plan for the NPI implementation. Effective May 23, 2007 through September 30, 2007, the providers will be required to submit both the NPI and the Legacy ID (Medicaid provider ID – 9 digit provider type and ID) on their claims.
 - The NPI will be reported in the 2010 AA segment loop NM 108 and 109 and the Legacy ID and Employee Identification Number (EIN) will be reported in the loop segment REF 01 and REF 02.
- If the software utilized by the providers is unable to duplicate the REF loop to enter both the EIN and Legacy ID modifications will be needed to allow for this. To get claims paid in while modifications are being made providers may have to omit the NPI and return to the previous entries for those fields. If this is done they will receive an “informational” edit stating that the NPI is missing or invalid. This edit will not reject the claims it is only informational.

Parental Consent

- The workgroup raised the issue again of why the Medicaid application cannot be used to satisfy the IDEA requirement for parental consent.
 - MDCH staff previously presented this request to the Office of Legal Affairs and it was determined that MDCH was in compliance with HIPAA (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act) but that the ISDs might not be in compliance with FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act).
- The ISDs are considering submitting their own request to the Attorney Generals Office for review and will gather data from other states to see what they have done.

LEA Net Update

- There were over 100 participants in the LEAnet conference held May 10, 11 2007.
- The purpose of the LEA net is to protect and promote school based health services for children
- LEAnet is fighting against the proposed cuts in school based administrative services, targeted case management and transportation services.
