Dear Tribal Chair and Health Director:

RE: Renewal Applications for the Comprehensive Health Care Program and Healthy Kids Dental Waivers and Waiving Section 1902(e) of the Social Security Act to Transition Children from the Existing MICHild Program into a Proposed MICHild Medicaid Expansion Program

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice of intent to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the request by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) renewal applications for the Section 1915(b) Comprehensive Health Care Program (CHCP) Waiver and Section 1915(b) Healthy Kids Dental (HKD) Waiver, and a request to waive Section 1902(e) of the Social Security Act, as necessary to transition children from the State's existing MICHild program into a proposed MICHild Medicaid expansion program.

The MICHild-eligible population will be added to the renewed CHCP Waiver, and will follow existing managed care enrollment procedures. The MICHild eligible population will also be added to the renewed HKD Waiver, and will receive the HKD benefit. As a result, Native Americans eligible for the MICHild program will have the option of electing to receive services through managed care or fee for service. Pending approval from CMS, the proposed effective date for the renewed waivers is January 1, 2016.

By waiving Section 1902(e), the State will be able to seamlessly transition current MICHild beneficiaries into the proposed MICHild Medicaid expansion program.


There is no public hearing scheduled for these waivers. In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual meetings for the purposes of consultation in order to discuss these waiver and waiver amendments, according to the tribes' preference. This consultation meeting will allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal.
