Dear Tribal Chair and Health Director:

RE: Notice of Amendment to Section 1115 Demonstration Waiver and Proposed State Plan Amendment

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice of intent to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the request by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit an amendment to the Section 1115 Demonstration Waiver, known as the Healthy Michigan Plan, and a related State Plan Amendment.

The MDHHS Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 budget includes increases to copay amounts for Healthy Michigan Plan beneficiaries at or above 100% of the Federal Poverty Level. If permitted by federal law and regulation, these beneficiaries would be charged \$4 for a physician office visit, \$100 for an inpatient hospital stay, \$4 and \$8 for preferred and non-preferred drugs, respectively, \$8 for an emergency room visit and \$4 for a hospital outpatient visit or any other medical provider visit. Per guidance from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, an amendment to the Section 1115 Demonstration Waiver, known as the Healthy Michigan Plan, is needed to effectuate these increases, and a State Plan Amendment may also be required. MDHHS anticipates minimal impact to Native American beneficiaries due to the regulatory limitations on cost-sharing for many of these individuals. The anticipated effective date of this change is expected to be no earlier than January 1, 2016, pending approval by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

There is no public hearing scheduled for this change. Input is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this Notice of Intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS Liaison to the Michigan Tribes. In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual meetings for the purposes of consultation in order to discuss this change, according to the tribes' preference. This consultation meeting will allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal. MDHHS appreciates the continued opportunity to work collaboratively with you to care for the residents of our state.
