Charge

- Work toward the realization of the Task Force on Nursing Education Vision: *Nursing Education in Michigan is an integrated, collaborative, efficient nursing education system responsive to the health care needs of the people of the State*. Provide leadership, guidance, and support to make the changes necessary as the Vision becomes a reality. Seek funding to support systemic changes and evaluation of changes.
- Oversee implementation of TFNE recommendations such as national accreditation, quality and safety education, residency programs, APRN education expansion, and nursing education capacity improvement. Use a systems approach in implementing the recommendations, with a high level of coordination, communication, and collaboration.

- Create a 21st century nursing education collaborative with its eyes on the requirements of the future. Include and work with nursing education administrators, nurse executives, nursing organizations, policy-makers, and healthcare stakeholders to: a) improve nursing education through initiatives and collaborative approaches, b) disseminate best practices & teaching tools, c) advocate for efficient and effective allocation of resources, d) oversee evaluation of these efforts, and e) as a learning community, collectively disseminate MNEC findings.
