

Michigan Narcan Protocol Frequently Asked Questions

1. Who will pay for the Narcan and supplies required for administration?
 - A. Each Medical Control Authority has a process in place that is used for other medications. It will be up to the Medical Control Authority to follow their already established procedures.
2. How many doses of Narcan are required to be carried?
 - A. It is up to each Medical Control Authority to determine how many doses need to be stocked.
3. How will the Narcan be distributed to agencies?
 - A. Each Medical Control Authority has pre-established procedures for purchase, stocking and re-stocking pharmaceuticals that are used in their jurisdiction.
4. Can a Medical Control Authority require Medical First Responder agencies to purchase their own Narcan?
 - A. The Narcan will be purchased according to the Medical Control Authority procedure.
5. Will there be a training module available?
 - A. A training module for Narcan administration has been developed and distributed to all of the Medical Control Authorities and ICs.
6. Is the State mandating autoinjectors?
 - A. The State is not mandating autoinjectors. The recommended administration for MFRs, EMTs and Specialists is intranasal.
7. If law enforcement agencies opt to carry Narcan is the Medical Control Authority responsible for the oversight of that program?
 - A. The Medical Control Authority does not have statutory authority to provide oversight to law enforcement agencies for this program. If a law enforcement agency chooses to carry Narcan, it is up to the law enforcement agency to determine how they will manage the program.
8. How does Narcan need to be secured in the vehicle?
 - A. Medication must be carried in a locked compartment in the vehicle.
