## Nancy's Story

A retired U.S. Navy captain in the reserve, Susick was called on in 2003 to serve during Operation Iraqi Freedom. As the mother of a 6- and 8-year-old at the time, she fulfilled her duty at the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland for four months. Today, Susick is back home in Michigan where she is serving as the president of Beaumont Hospital, Troy. But there's more to it than that – she's not only the first female president of the hospital, but she is also the first nurse to serve in that capacity.

“Being the first woman to lead is just so exciting for me,” she told DBusiness in 2013. “But I’ll always be a nurse at heart.”
