Overview

This is a 4 day, 30 hour basic training course designed to provide specific knowledge and clinical understanding which will contribute to the prevention and treatment of compulsive gambling.

Objectives

At the completion of this 30-hour course participants will be able to:

- Explain the progression of the disorder of a gambling addiction.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the addicted gamblers belief system.
- Demonstrate competency in the use of the various tools for assessment and diagnosis.
- Identify and describe the types of gamblers.
- Identify several models for understanding the functioning of the gambler.
- Summarize treatment goals for the recovery of the addicted gambler.
- List the phases of the Miller Four Phase Treatment Model.
- Define the necessary life skills and stages of recovery for the gambler.
- Identify significant psychological factors in the development of a gambling disorder.
- List key concepts of legal aspects to a gambling addicted client.

Treatment

Michigan Department of Community Health (DCH) funds “Problem Gambling Treatment” via contract with Neighborhood Service Organization (NSO). NSO operates the Michigan Problem Gambling Helpline and is continuing the development of the Statewide Treatment Network for pathological gamblers and their families. NSO is interested in contracting with organizations which employ qualified staff as well as with qualified individual practitioners throughout the state to provide treatment services to persons who are eligible for assistance under the terms of this contract.

The following are the basic requirements to qualify for inclusion on NSO’s panel of service providers:

- A master’s degree in social work, psychology or counseling.
- A license, registration or certification to practice in the state of Michigan.
- Completion of 30 hours of gambling specific training from an approved source.

Professional references are required.

Completion of this training does not guarantee inclusion on the statewide treatment panel or referrals for treatment from NSO.
