Physicians are initially qualified when they have met the license, certification/training, initial CME and initial experience requirements. After meeting all the initial requirements, interpreting physicians must maintain the continuing education and continuing experience requirements to remain qualified. Physicians failing to maintain the continuing requirements must requalify prior to performing independent mammographic interpretation.
