PUBLIC COMMENT

David Bach stated that the DEA number for residents is the same number as the hospital's DEA number.

Rose Baran indicated that hospital residents have an individual suffix that follows the hospital DEA number. Further, that it is possible that an attending physician would only have the hospital DEA number with their corresponding suffix if that physician only practiced in the hospital.

Wissel explained that problems can arise for patients when a physician's suffix is not placed on the prescription and the incorrect physician is reported to MAPS.

Greg Baran reminded the board that pursuant to statute it is the physician's duty to have the correct DEA number and suffix, if applicable, on the prescription.

Sue Farida indicated that the JCPP committee is exploring ways to better educate professionals.

Assistant AG Katranji-Zeni indicated that the Michigan Dental Association has an alternative dispute mechanism.


ANNOUNCEMENTS
