**Michigan Civil Rights Commission to Meet Monday, March 23  
in Farmington Hills**

*Michigan Cyber Safety Initiatives will be highlighted*

Lansing - The Michigan Civil Rights Commission will host a regular public meeting from 2 pm to 4 pm on Monday, March 23, at the Holocaust Memorial Center Auditorium, 28123 Orchard Lake Road in Farmington Hills.

During the meeting, Mary Gager Drew, Administrator of the Consumer Protection Division of the Michigan Attorney General's Office, will address the Commission on OK2SAY and the Michigan Cyber Safety Initiative.

Ricardo Resio, appointed by Governor Snyder to the Commission in February, will be sworn in at the meeting.

Individuals who wish to address the Commission on civil rights issues will have an opportunity to speak during the public comment period at the end of the meeting.

The Michigan Civil Rights Commission was created by the Michigan Constitution to carry out constitutional and legal guarantees against discrimination. The Commission is charged with investigating alleged discrimination against any person because of religion, race, color or national origin, sex, age, marital status, height, weight, arrest record, and physical and mental disability.
