



Summer Food Service Program in Michigan

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) was established to ensure that low income children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session. Free meals, that meet federal nutrition guidelines, are provided to all children at approved SFSP sites in areas with significant concentrations of low income children. This federally funded meal program can be sponsored by public and private non-profit schools, residential camps, colleges or universities, government agencies, and other private non-profit organizations.
