


Section 31a (6) of the State School Aid Act for 2013-2014 designates an amount of \$3,557,300 to Baldwin Community Schools:

“(6) From the funds allocated under subsection (1), there is allocated for 2013-2014 an amount not to exceed \$3,557,300 to support child and adolescent health centers. These grants shall be awarded for 5 consecutive years beginning with 2003-2004 in a form and manner approved jointly by the department and the department of community health. Each grant recipient shall remain in compliance with the terms of the grant award or shall forfeit the grant award for the duration of the 5-year period after the noncompliance. To continue to receive funding for a child and adolescent health center under this section a grant recipient shall ensure that the child and adolescent health center has an advisory committee and that at least one-third of the members of the advisory committee are parents or legal guardians of school-aged children. A child and adolescent health center program shall recognize the role of a child’s parents or legal guardian in the physical and emotional well-being of the child. Funding under this subsection shall be used to support child and adolescent health center services provided to children up to age 21. If any funds allocated under this subsection are not used for the purposes of this subsection for the fiscal year in which they are allocated, those unused funds shall be used that fiscal year to avoid or minimize any proration that would otherwise be required under subsection (14) for that fiscal year.”

These funds are awarded to Baldwin Community Schools, who, in turn works with the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) to Medicaid match the state aid dollars. Funds are then awarded to school districts throughout the state through a competitive RFP process jointly run by MDCH and MDE.

This is a legislatively-designated allocation. No competition or bidding is allowable.
