 - ✓ Possible Follow-up:
 - i. What are the most important topics you feel should be addressed in the health course?
8. How important is it to you that HIV/AIDS information is required to be taught by schools in Michigan?
9. How important is it to you that the decisions we make as a Board affect all students?
10. How important is it to you to listen to others' opinions?
11. How important is it that people on the board be open to changing their minds given information that is shared by others?
