Emergency Medical or Late-Onset Condition: This student developed a sudden medical condition or suffered an injury which will prevent him or her from accessing the examination.

Common conditions that qualify in this category are students who receive an injury to their dominant hand or arm (e.g., broken wrist) and cannot write. Schools may arrange for these students to mark the answers to the multiple-choice questions in the test book. Testing staff can transcribe the answers to the answer document after testing. If the student must take the writing test, a scribe may be necessary for the student to dictate the essay response. Other medical emergencies or conditions will also qualify, such as a sudden loss of vision. ACT will consider each case individually.
