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## ***How ATS Project Success Explains Their Tutoring Program, in Their Own Words:***

ATS Project Success offers eligible K-8 students support in language arts, reading, and mathematics. Services are provided online in the comfort and safety of the students' homes with a loaned, pre-programmed computer, SuccessMaker(r) software, and dial-up Internet service at no cost. Tutors assess students to determine the curriculum, learning objectives, and instructional level activities. Students are encouraged to complete two one-hour sessions a week. Students' progress is monitored online, followed by e-mails to the students, weekly calls and monthly reports (English or Spanish) to the parents, and monthly reports to the district. We work with schools and teachers to make sure the students' efforts in the program are helping them succeed in the classroom as well. Tutors meet or exceed the qualifications for paraprofessionals to comply with NCLB legislation; 66% have two years experience, at a minimum, tutoring SES students in the program.
