Academic Tutoring / McCully's was the recipient of the annual award from the Michigan Association of State and Federal Program Specialists for 2008, "In recognition of excellent service and dedication to providing Michigan Teachers with quality professional development and educational programs to help all students succeed." Academic Tutoring/McCully's provides 3 students per teacher as our average student to teacher ratio with a maximum of 5 students. Smaller group sizes or individual tutoring may be provided as needed. Special education students receive services as determined by their Individualized Educational Learning Plan. Our assessment results show an average increase, after approximately 30 hours of tutoring, to be 1 stanine score, or above, of academic growth. We serve students in kindergarten through high school. All instructional materials and books are provided based upon the student's academic assessment. Consistent parent and teacher communication is an important part of our tutoring program.
