APPROPRIATE USE OF FUNDS FOR IDEA SECTION 611, PART B & STATE AID

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY (AT)

Question: Can funds be used to reimburse the employment costs for an Assistive Technology Assistant?

Answer: Yes. An AT Assistant could be defined as a non-degreed staff member who consults with LEA staff regarding software and computer uses. This position is fundable to the extent they work with special education teachers related to technology issues. This position should not be listed as a Para-professional.

Question: Are Assistive Technology Toolkits a reimbursable expenditure?

Answer: Yes. AT Toolkits are reimbursable if purchased for students with IEPs or if purchased for all teachers through a professional development activity. AT Toolkits are not reimbursable if directly purchased for students without IEPs.

Funding Sources:

- IDEA Special Education Regular Award
- ARRA Special Education Award
- State Aid funds may be used only if AT Toolkits are purchased for students with IEPs or for professional development for Special Education Teachers only.

Coding:

- Function Code 122, Object Code 5110 if purchased for students with IEPs
- Function Code 221, Object Code 5110 if part of professional development activity

CONSTRUCTION

Question: Can funds be used for purposes of Construction and Alteration?

Answer: Yes, but ARRA Special Education Award funds ONLY. Please review guidance and process document posted on the MDE, OSE-EIS website.

- Function Code 456, Object Code 64XX

EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

Question: Can funds be used for Early Childhood programs and services for children ages Birth – 2?

Answer: No. Funds are allocated for children ages 3 – 21.

EARLY INTERVENING SERVICES (EIS)

Question: Can funds be used to provide Early Intervening Services to Children in Preschool, ages 3-5?

Answer: No. EIS is specific to IDEA and is defined as services for students without an IEP in Kindergarten through Grade 12, with an emphasis on Kindergarten through Grade 3.

COMPUTERS / TECHNOLOGY / SOFTWARE

Question: Can funds be used to “completely refurbish” a computer lab?

Answer: No. However, purchasing technology for a computer lab to accommodate a student’s IEP is reimbursable.

- Function Code 122, Object Code 5110 if **below** capital outlay threshold of \$5,000 for Federal Funds or \$1,000 for State Funds
- Function Code 122, Object Code 6410 if **above** capital outlay threshold of \$5,000 for Federal Funds or \$1,000 for State Funds

Question: Can funds be used to purchase computers for Special Education Administrators and their assigned Clerical Support Staff?

Answer: Yes. Provided under Permissive Use of Funds, Administrative Case Management, IDEA §613(a)(4)(B).

- ARRA Special Education Award

Coding:

- Function Code 226, Object Code 5110 if **below** capital outlay threshold of \$5,000 for Federal Funds
- Function Code 226, Object Code 6410 if **above** capital outlay threshold of \$5,000 for Federal Funds

Question: Can funds be used to purchase computers for Students with IEPs housed in co-taught classrooms?

Answer: Yes. Computers and technology are reimbursable in order to accommodate a student’s IEP.

Funding Sources:

- IDEA Special Education Regular Award
- ARRA Special Education Award

Coding:

- Function Code 122, Object Code 5110

Question: Can funds be used by an LEA or PSA to purchase student data tracking systems for students with IEPs, such as Zangle or Power School?

Answer: Yes. The funds used to purchase student data tracking systems should be in proportion to the number of students with IEPs.

Function Code 284 or 285, Object Code 59XX for purchased software, 3450 for license to use software only

Question: Can funds be used to purchase reading and math intervention software programs to be used for students with or without IEPs in the general education setting?

Answer: Yes. Software expenses are reimbursable in order to accommodate a student with an IEP.

Question: Can funds be used to purchase IEP data systems?

Answer: Yes.

Question: Are Smartboards (with associated computer, LCD & other accessories) and similar technologies a reimbursable expenditure?

- Answer:**
- Smartboards are reimbursable when written into a student's IEP.
 - Smartboards are reimbursable when purchased for a special education classroom for students with IEPs.
 - Smartboards **may** be reimbursable for general education classrooms that also provide instruction for students with IEPs, but only up to an amount allocable to the proportion of students with IEPs.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT / TRAINING

Question: Can funds be used to support parent/guardian training?

Answer: Yes.

Funding Sources:

- IDEA Special Education Regular Award
- ARRA Special Education Award
- State Aid

Coding:

- Function Code 216 or 331 for Parent Involvement, Object Code 51XX

Question: Can funds be used to provide for Professional Development (PD)?
Can funds be used to reimburse employment costs for non-special education credentialed staff to provide PD services?
Can funds be used to hire "master subject teachers" in content areas to teach other teachers to improve instruction?
Can funds be used to provide PD for all staff members in RtI, Positive Behavior and Literacy Supports?

Answer: Yes. Funds may be used to reimburse employment/contracting costs for individuals providing PD. There are no requirements specific to the credentials/certifications of the person providing the PD. In order for the PD to be reimbursable, the skills obtained through the PD must have applicability for students with IEPs.

Question: Can funds be used to pay for substitutes to release special education and general education teachers to attend professional development?

Answer: Yes. Professional development must be designed to support students with IEPs in the general education setting.

RESPONSE TO SCIENTIFIC INTERVENTIONS (RTI)

Question: How can we use IDEA Regular and IDEA ARRA funds to pay for activities associated with Response to Scientific Intervention models?

Answer: **Reimbursable RtI activities:**

- Professional development (PD) around RtI is reimbursable for all staff members, the skills obtained through the PD must have applicability for students with IEPs.
- Reimbursable providers of the training can include staff with general education or special education credentials as well as purchased services.
- Supplies, books and various supports directly utilized in the trainings, and as examples, are reimbursable.
- Reimbursement for other supports such as software tools, which could facilitate district wide assessment after the trainings, should be apportioned between the training and the benefit to the district outside of (or after) the training.
- Program designs for Special Education Teachers in special education classrooms utilizing RtI model techniques of assessment, instruction and interventions are reimbursable.
- IDEA funded Special Education Teachers may provide consultative supports, supporting the Child Find and other evaluation responsibilities.
- Due to IDEA's child find and assessment requirements, portions of universal screening activities allocable to students with IEPs would be reimbursable.

Coordinated Early Intervening Services (CEIS)

- Program designs electing to use up to 15% of the Part B allocation for CEIS teachers (general education or special education credentialed) providing interventions are reimbursable. Interventions must be tier 2 and tier 3, within an RtI model and being provided to students k -12 at risk of being identified as needing special education.
- Materials supporting allowable CEIS activities (the increased interventions over and above the core or tier 1 instruction), would also be reimbursable.

NON-Reimbursable RtI activities:

- General RtI model activities such as core curriculum, core assessments, universal screening and direct instructional staff for all students would not be reimbursable.

SALARIES / EMPLOYMENT COSTS

Question: Can funds be used to reimburse the employment costs for Special Education Directors, Supervisors, or Clerical Support Staff?

Answer: Yes. Rule 340.1750, requires ISD Directors of special education to be employed/contracted full-time and LEA Directors must be employed/contracted not less than half-time. Any variations to that would require a Waiver of Administrative Rule. Rule 340.1751, requires Supervisors of special education to be employed/contracted not less than half-time. Secretary/Clerical Support Staff working 100% of their employment in special education.

Question: Can funds be used to reimburse employment costs for a Teacher Consultant (TC), without a caseload, to support RtI initiatives?

Answer: Yes. A TC without a caseload may support teachers with RtI initiatives as long as they are providing support to classroom teachers and not working directly with students. TCs working directly with students with an IEP must carry a caseload or the LEA must apply for a waiver.

Question: Can funds be used to pay for the employment costs to employ a "Data Person"?

Answer: Yes. This position is reimbursable to the extent they work with IDEA data mandates.

- Function Code 284, Object Codes 1590 Salary, 2XXX Benefits

Question: Can funds be used to pay for the employment costs for a part-time non-Special Education credentialed administrator, for example a building Principal?

Answer: No. Please reference the State School Aid Act, Section 51a(7)(a).

TRANSPORTATION

Question: Can funds be used to purchase buses?

Answer: Yes, but ARRA Special Education Award funds ONLY. Please review guidance and process document posted on the MDE, OSE-EIS website.
