How C&B Tutoring, LLC Explains Their Tutoring Program, in Their Own Words:

The MDE has not edited this description.

C&B Tutoring, LLC (C&B Tutoring) provides local off-site tutoring to students in grades kindergarten-8th grade and includes small group instruction in ratios of 5 students :1 tutor or 1 student :1 tutor. Group size is held at 25 students; 2 hours per day over a period of 3-4 days per week for 8 weeks. Progress reports are completed weekly and individualized academic plans for students are created and assessed for strengths while recognizing areas which need improvement. C&B Tutoring utilizes curriculum components from Great Source and SkillsTutor. The Every Day Counts Math curriculum will be used and under SkillsTutor, Reading Comprehension and Vocabulary will be used. Both curricula connect to the specific content expectations identified by the state and LEAs in that each curriculum component listed in the state standards corresponds with specific locations within the Great Source and SkillsTutor curricula.
