### Dr. Ivory Toldson's Bio

Dr. Ivory A. Toldson is a senior research analyst at CBCF, an associate professor of counseling psychology at the Howard University School of Education, and the editor-in-chief of the Journal of Negro Education. Dr. Toldson is credited with more than 30 publications and research presentations in more than 20 U.S. states, Paris, Puerto Rico, the Dominican Republic, Scotland and South Africa. He has been featured on C-SPAN2 Books, NPR News, The Al Sharpton Show on XM Satellite Radio and WKYS Community Connection. Dr. Toldson won EboNetwork's Changing Faces award for outstanding literary achievement for his novel Black Sheep. Dr. Toldson is also the author of the Breaking Barriers Series, which analyzes academic success indicators from national surveys that together give voice to nearly 10,000 African American male pupils from schools across the country. After completing coursework for a Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology at Temple University, Dr. Toldson became a correctional and forensic psychology resident at the U.S. Penitentiary. There, he completed his dissertation on black men in the criminal justice system. Upon completion, Dr. Toldson joined the faculty of Southern University and became the fourth recipient of the prestigious DuBois Fellowship from the U.S. Department of Justice. He also served as the clinical director of the Manhood Training Village in Baton Rouge. He has held visiting academic appointments at Emory University, Drexel University and Morehouse School of Medicine, and has accepted invitations to lecture at Columbia University, University of Tennessee Health Science Campus, SUNY-Stony Brook and Montgomery College.
