Our qualified tutors are available to service students at home, at our centers, in schools, or at other locations. Many tutors speak Spanish and are Special Education Certified. Students attend 2-4 hours per class, weekly, after school, weekends, summers and they receive tutoring in one-on-one and/or group sessions. Tutors diagnose each student's needs, and prepare individualized learning plans that utilize direct tutor instruction and on-line computer programs designed to help increase academic achievement, and improve learning and memory skills. Monthly progress is reported to parents and skills growth is measured at the end of the program.
