How Education Empowerment Foundation, Inc. Explains Their Tutoring Program, in Their Own Words:

Education Empowerment Foundation, Inc. (EEF) provides tutoring services to children in grades K-5 middle school, 6 grade, in two subject areas, reading and mathematics; including students with learning disabilities and English language learners functioning on an independent level. Students must be enrolled in a school eligible to participate as described by the No Child Left Behind Act, 2001. EEF tutors are experienced, degreed professionals and/or state certified instructors. Tutors work with small groups of five students. The sessions are scheduled three times a week and each session is two hours long, for a total of 36 hours. Tutoring sessions are held at local schools or other approved off-site locations. Sessions are held directly after school hours. Transportation is not provided by the Foundation. Tutors tailor individualized learning plans for each student that build the skills and habits students need to succeed in school.
