### Introduction

English Learners (ELs) are students acquiring proficiency in the English language. This document lists, describes, and provides links to data sources offered to schools and districts to help them support English Learner (EL) students. Additionally, this document provides link resources describing how to request access to secure EL data sources (i.e., those sources with student-level data or very small aggregate counts).

### EL Data Sources Overview

The table below lists the EL data sources grouped by:

- (1) Access Level (whether they are available publicly or only to secure, authorized users),
- (2) Data Level (whether they provide individual student or aggregate data [e.g., counts, average scores, etc.])
- (3) Whether the data source is available for districts, schools, and different sizes of EL programs.

<b>Public</b> School Index	School Index is Michigan's accountability system used to fulfill federal requirements to identify schools most in need of further support. It provides aggregate outcome data in seven areas for the school overall and for each student group in the school. One of those areas is English Learner (EL) Progress, which measures the percent of EL students demonstrating either English language proficiency or adequate growth to become English language proficient. For groups with 10-29 students, data are displayed but not included in calculations. <u>Please note:</u> All secure, authorized user, data sources providing aggregate data are for school and district internal use only. Only public reports should be shared publicly. This is because secure, authorized user, reports may contain data for groups smaller than 10 students and sharing them publicly could violate student privacy rights protected by federal law (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act; FERPA).
