**Fall 2010 Grades 3-9 Accommodated Formats**

**Braille** (produced from a unique test booklet)

Braille versions are available for students with visual impairments whose IEPs indicate they are an appropriate assessment accommodation and who routinely read Braille during instruction. All Braille booklets are: (1) produced by the American Printing House (APH) for the Blind, (2) follow APH transcriptions and printing standards, (3) use contracted Braille, (4) use Nemeth numbers (where needed), and (5) use tactile graphics in place of visual graphics.

Braille versions of the assessments come packaged with a companion *Assessment Administrator Booklet for Braille (AABB)*, which includes transcriber notes indicating how the items and/or directions have been adapted for Braille. MI-Access Braille kits also contain a student answer document and a Braille ruler (if applicable). Students using a Braille version must have their answers transferred onto a scannable answer document. MEAP and MI-Access *Print to Braille Correspondence* provide assessment administrators with a page-by-page content comparison of the Braille test booklet and the companion AABB. **Enlarged Print** (produced from a Form 1 test booklet)

Enlarged print versions of assessment booklets are available for students with visual impairments whose IEPs indicate they are an appropriate assessment accommodation and who routinely read enlarged print during instruction. Enlarged print booklets are produced by the American Printing House (APH) for the blind, and are printed in approximately 15-point font.

All enlarged print versions come packaged with a standard print Form 1 test booklet. MI-Access enlarged print kits also contain a student answer document and an enlarged print ruler (if applicable). Students using an enlarged print version must have their answers transferred onto a scannable answer document.

**Audio CD** (requires use of Form 1 test booklet)

Audio CDs are available for students whose IEPs indicate they are an appropriate assessment accommodation and who routinely use audio CDs during instruction. Audio CDs come packaged with a standard print Form 1 test booklet. MI-Access audio CD kits also contain a student answer document and a standard ruler (if applicable). CDs may be used to administer the assessment to small groups (defined as five or fewer students\*) as long as (1) the students mark their own answers, and (2) they use headsets, allowing the students to control the equipment. Otherwise, CDs may only be used in one-on-one assessment situations. Audio CDs are available for mathematics, science, and social studies for MEAP and all content areas for MI-Access. Additional Form 1 test booklets may need to be ordered if the audio CDs are used with more than one student.

**Video DVD** (requires use of Form 1 test booklet)

English language learners (ELLs) at the basic or lower intermediate proficiency levels are eligible to use video (DVD) versions of MEAP assessments. When specified in the IEP or Section 504 Plan, students with disabilities are also eligible to

use the video version of the MEAP tests. DVDs may be used to administer the assessment to small groups (defined as five or fewer students).

Videos (DVDs) are available in Spanish, Arabic, and English for mathematics, science, and social studies. The video DVDs of the MEAP assessments come packaged with a standard print Form 1 test booklet. Additional Form 1 test booklets may need to be ordered when the DVD is used with more than one student.

**Reader Script** (requires use of Form 1 test booklet)

Reader Scripts are available for use with students whose ELL instruction, IEP, or Section 504 Plan indicate they are an appropriate assessment accommodation and who routinely use a reader accommodation during instruction. The Reader Script contains instructions and notes to the reader and is packaged with a standard print Form 1 test booklet.

Reader Scripts may be used to administer the assessment to small groups (defined as five or fewer students) as long as the students mark their own answers. Extra test booklets may need to be ordered when the Reader Script is used with more than one student. Reader scripts are available for MEAP mathematics, science, and social studies.
