SUBJECT: Approval of Criteria for Section 63, Joint Capital Project Between an Intermediate School District and a Local Health Department

The State School Aid Act provides \$250,000 to an eligible intermediate school district that is participating in a joint capital project with a local health department in which the local health department is constructing a new building on the intermediate school district's property that will have an enclosed hallway to connect with a career and technical education center. This will allow both institutions to provide curriculum and training to state-approved career and technical education programs in the dental assistant and environmental sciences categories.

It is recommended that the State Board of Education approve the criteria for Section 63 - Joint Capital Project Between an Intermediate School District and a Local Health Department as attached to the Superintendent's memorandum dated November 1, 2016.

Criteria for Section 63, Joint Capital Project Between an Intermediate School District and a Local Health Department

The State Board of Education has adopted guiding principles and strategic goals for developing Michigan into a top 10 education state in 10 years.

To the extent possible, all grant criteria and grant awards will serve to further attain the above goals.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES AND STRATEGIC GOALS THIS CRITERIA SUPPORT

This grant supports the guiding principles and strategic goals of the State Board of Education (SBE) and Michigan Department of Education (MDE) for the following two goals: (3) Develop, support, and sustain a high-quality, prepared, and collaborative education workforce; and (4) Reduce the impact of high-risk factors, including poverty, and provide equitable resources to meet the needs of all students to ensure that they have access to quality educational opportunities.

PURPOSE / BACKGROUND OF GRANT

Type of Grant Program:

The State School Aid Act provides \$250,000 for payment to an intermediate school district (ISD) that is participating in a joint capital project with a local health department in which the local health department is constructing a new building on the ISD's property that will have an enclosed hallway to connect with a career and technical education center. The MDE has determined that the only eligible entity in the state that can provide this service is the Van Buren ISD, in partnership with the Van Buren/Cass District Health Department.

Grant funding is based on the following requirement:

- Eligible costs are what the eligible ISD has incurred to support a joint capital project with a local health department in which the health department is constructing a new building on the ISD's property that will have an enclosed hallway to connect with a career and technical education center.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS AND TARGET POPULATION SERVED

The Van Buren ISD is the eligible entity.

The target population is students within the Van Buren ISD who desire to be enrolled in dental assistant and environmental sciences programs.
