The State Board of Education has embraced five core strategies to ensure substantial and meaningful improvement in academic achievement in chronically-underperforming schools. The 21st CCLC program's primary focus is to assist chronically-underperforming schools achieve high academic success through high quality, after-school programs. To the extent possible, all grant criteria and grant awards will include priority consideration of the SBE Strategic Goal and the Strategic Initiatives. The 21st Century Community Learning Centers Grants will address the strategic goal by giving priority to applications that propose to service students in high-priority schools. In addition, the grants address the initiative regarding the integration of schools and communities by encouraging collaboration. Other initiatives may be addressed through specific grant proposals.

3. Background/Purpose of Grant Program: The purpose of the 21st Century Community Learning Centers Grant Program is to create community learning centers for those times when school is not in session that provide students with academic enrichment opportunities as well as additional activities designed to complement their regular academic program. Limited programming may also be provided for the families of enrolled students. Grants are targeted to communities and schools that serve low-income students who attend low-performing schools.

4. Target Population to be Served by Grant:

Applicants were required to propose services to schools with 30 percent or more of the students enrolled eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

5. Eligible Applicants:

Initial: Eligible applicants for the 21st CCLC grants are local education agencies, including local and intermediate school districts and public school academies, community-based organizations and faith-based organizations. Consortia of two or more such agencies, organizations, or entities are also eligible. Also, grantees whose previous funding has expired (Cohort A, B, and C originally funded in FY 2002, 2003, or 2004) are eligible applicants.

Continuation: Those district/agencies approved for a 2007-2008 (Cohort D) or 2008-2009 (Cohort E) 21st CCLC Grant.
