Background/Purpose of Grant Program: The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) is a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) household commodity program which provides supplemental food to local community action agencies (CAAs), Wayne County Nutrition Services (WCNS), and the Food Bank Council of Michigan (FBCM) members. In FY 2008, Michigan received over \$7.7 million in entitlement and bonus foods and approximately \$2 million in administrative funds for the program.
