

(B)(1)(ii) – *Amendment to Phase II Application Submission – June 18, 2010*

Michigan stated, in its Phase II Race to the Top application, submitted to USDOE on May 26, 2010, that the state has

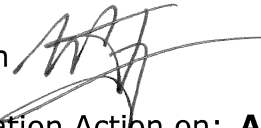
developed a process and timeline for the adoption of the Common Core Standards (see Appendices B.12 and B.13). The legal process for adopting standards in Michigan requires approval by the State Board of Education (Section 380.1278 Revised School Code; see Appendix B.14). The Common Core Standards will be presented to the State Board of Education for consideration in June, 2010. The Michigan Department of Education will submit an amendment to this application to United States Department of Education no later than June 30, 2010, providing evidence of the State Board of Education's adoption of the Common Core Standards (p. B-4).

This amendment and included attachment provide evidence demonstrating that the State Board of Education adopted the Common Core State Standards, in their entirety, on June 15, 2010. The attachment includes a Michigan State Board of Education Memorandum dated June 16, 2010.

Kathleen Straus moved, seconded by Elizabeth Bauer, that the State Board of Education approve the *Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts and Literacy in History/Social Studies, Science, and Technical Subjects* (June 2010) and the *Common Core State Standards for Mathematics* (June 2010), as described in the Superintendent's memorandum dated June 8, 2010, and direct the Department to proceed in collaboration with LEAs and ISDs to implement internationally benchmarked college- and career-readiness K-12 standards.
