Results include data received by the October 1, 2008 data collection deadline. This is data that will be reported in the February 2009 Annual Performance Report. Data received after this deadline are not included on the website.

The SPP Indicator 13 addresses the transition of students from secondary school to adult life; this indicator specifically requires states to collect data on the percentage of youth aged 16 and older with an individualized education plan (IEP) that includes coordinated and measurable annual IEP goals and transition services that will reasonably enable the student to meet his or her postsecondary goals [20 U.S.C. 1416 (a)(3)(B)].

The SPP Indicator 14 includes post-school outcomes, specifically, the percentage of youth who had an IEP, are no longer in secondary school, and who have been competitively employed, enrolled in some type of postsecondary school, or both, within one year of leaving high school. [20 U.S.C. 1416(a)(3)(B)].

Data verification and correction, which began on October 2, 2008, will continue until the data is loaded into the Continuous Improvement & Monitoring System (CIMS-2) electronic workbooks for the April 15, 2009 roll-out. At this time, findings will be issued to local districts with uncorrected noncompliant records.

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
