**SUBJECT:** Estimated Allocations for the Transition Coordination Grant for  
FY 2010-2011

For your planning purposes, the attached chart shows your estimated allocation for the Transition Coordination grant for FY 2010-2011. Estimated allocations are based on preliminary information we received from the United States Department of Education (USDOED) and student count data (please refer to the attached chart for calculation methodology). An additional amount of \$5,000 for expenses incurred for transition coordination has been added to your award. Allowable expenditures are detailed in the Michigan Electronic Grants System (MEGS) application for this portion of the award.

You will receive a formal Grant Award Notification from Superintendent Michael Flanagan, pending receipt of the federal grant award from USDOED and final approval. Please note that your estimated amount could change based on the final grant award received from the USDOED.
