Education-Related Professional Learning Credit for School SUBJECT:

Safety Training

The Michigan Department of Education is continuing its approval of school safety training being used as education-related professional learning credit for renewing or progressing an educator certificate for the upcoming 2021-22 academic year. This is a renewal of an approval first granted for the 2017-18 academic year and extended through the 2020-21 academic year.

Districts may credit educators for school safety training provided to staff during this upcoming academic year as District Provided Professional Development (DPPD) through State Continuing Education Credit Hours (SCECHs). The training includes but is not limited to: bloodborne pathogens, First Aid/CPR/AED, EpiPen, active shooter, and any training related to safely opening and operating schools during the pandemic. Decisions on what constitutes school safety training are made at the local level.
