



- 50140 L'Anse Creuse Public Schools – Pioneer Residential Program – Harbor Oaks Hospital's allocation was reduced to zero because their program closed effective 5/31/09.
- 03000 Allegan Co. Sheriff Dept. and Allegan Co. Youth Home – Weston Hall changed fiscal agents to 03902 Outlook Academy from 03000 Allegan Area ESA.
- 09000 Allocations for The Lutheran Home and Parmenter Community Justice Center were reduced to zero because both facilities closed.
- 39010 Allocation for Kalamazoo County Juvenile Home – Intensive Learning Center was reduced to zero because the program is a community day program.
- 19000 Allocation for Clinton County Sheriff's Department was reduced to zero because the program closed.
- 54000 Allocation for Osceola County Jail was reduced to zero because the program closed.
- 72000 Allocation for Crawford County Jail was reduced to zero because the program closed.
- 82971 Allocations calculated for Blanche Kelso Bruce (strict discipline academy) for Connor, St. Jude's Home for Boys, Wolverine Shelter, and Victor's Center programs which should be funded under Part D.
