

What is the GSRP Mid-Year Report?

Great Start Readiness Program

Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP)

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Description

- The GSRP Mid-Year Report is designed to provide an interim report of GSRPs serving four-year-olds at-risk of educational failure.
- Includes teacher and associate teacher compensation and training, and the seven sections of the Program Quality Assessment (PQA).



Purpose

- This information is required by the Michigan legislature and criteria established by the State Board of Education.
- Data collected from the PQA is used by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) for statewide program evaluation of center-based Great Start Readiness Programs.



Completion of the Mid-Year Report

- It is a Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) requirement for all GSRP grantees implementing Center-Based preschool.
- Although GSRP Home-Based programs do not complete the PQA, there are mid-year reporting requirements for staff training and compensation.



Who Completes the Report?

- The Main Contact and Secondary Contact will have access to the electronic Mid-Year Report.
- Grantees with over 125 slots may want to allow additional people to enter data.
- Usernames and passwords will be provided for the people designated to enter data.



Multiple Classrooms, Multiple Reporters

- A grantee with multiple classrooms must ensure that the information included in Form A is completed individually for each teaching team.
- In cases where multiple people are entering data, the reporting task will have to be divided-up at the local level to prevent duplication of information.

Before You Begin:

- Access: determined by program administrators.
- District, PSA or Agency 5 digit code.
- Class IDs: determined locally.
- PQA data for each teaching team.
- Staff training and compensation data.
