


Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Michigan was 264. This was not significantly different from the average score of 264 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Michigan in 2015 (264) was not significantly different from their average score in 2013 (266) and in 2002 (265).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 32 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (33 percent) and in 2002 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 76 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (77 percent) and in 2002 (77 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2015, the average score in Michigan (264) was

- lower than those in 18 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 14 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 19 states/jurisdictions





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (28 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 7 points not significantly different from that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2015, female students in Michigan had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 10 points.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2002 (13 points).
