TOPIC SUMMARIES

I. Welcome and Introductions – *Larry Scott*

Larry welcomed the attendees and everyone introduced themselves, as well as their affiliations. He also explained various aspects of this meeting, stating the four required deliverables; financial map, workforce map, workforce training plan and a three year strategic plan encompassing all deliverables and an implementation plan. This grant also requires an interagency council made up of representatives from various stakeholder and partner agencies at the state, regional and local levels, including providers that provide services to adolescents between the ages of 16-21 focusing on transitional youth (foster care). He went on to explain that this is our fourth meeting, explaining the gaps, evidence practices, financial mapping, and workforce capacity, including demographics, such as age. If the deliverables are successful, we will be eligible to apply for a four year implementation grant.

II. Workforce Survey – *Angie Smith-Butterwick*

Angie said a link to the survey will be sent to the Prepaid Inpatient Health Plans (PIHP) and Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) directors who send to all the providers. MYTIE members have reviewed, as well as Recovery Oriented Systems of Care/Transformation Steering Committee (ROSC/TSC) members and responses are expected in three weeks. A report is due to the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT) the beginning of May 2016. If you have not seen the survey, the link can be sent to you by e-mailing Angie at SmithA8@michigan.gov. Angie goes on to explain some of the questions on the survey. At this point Larry talks about the reasons for some of the questions, such as the expansion of the current workforce and the need for more workers, levels of competency, and pay, among other issues. He also says that strategies are needed to attract individuals' to the field. We are also looking at Universities to offer courses; as there are only a few colleges. Larry and Liz also offered ideas and discussion with the members about how to accomplish these needs. Larry says as we think about workforce mapping and workforce training plan, keep in mind our partners; workforce and juvenile justice, jail diversion programs, etc., that provide substance abuse treatment services that target youth. Angie says OROSC recently developed a peer

training for SUD that may be past the BETA testing and will offer the training to regions. Peer specialists are now called “certified peer specialists.” To become a “Certified Peer Specialist,” a person must take the training OROSC is offering. Special populations are not offered. Larry says there are some states that have “recovery high schools” in Massachusetts that we are looking at, and he encourages this group to review.

Liz says the survey is ready and revisions have been added. Comments submitted have been added. Separate e-mails went to Julia and others that needed it. Please get this out to your network. III. Continuum of Care Document - Angie Smith-Butterwick

For gaps, challenges, and successes, Angie says we will be looking at what is available in our system, what needs to be revised, missing or cumbersome. The breakdown is 16-17 and 18-21 year olds because there is a difference in continuum of care for each age group. Add in information if you see problems during a transition period (adolescent to adult services). Liz says interviews will take place to cover this question on “transition.” Persons to speak on this include, Dr. McCall, and Wayne County Juvenile Justice, among others. For assessment coding; diagnostic, capacity and screening should be by “per month.” More discussion about questions to add to the survey. The governor is looking to increase the scope of the diversion council panel by 4 additional members statewide to add to the existing 14, who will look into these issues, such as dealing with the people on a street level. We are looking at crisis intervention and have the police officers trained about various mental health disorders. More discussion about police officer training and funding and the need for both/more. This workforce survey will be sent to juvenile justice, and law enforcement agencies who interact with family courts, drug courts, diversion programs and peers.

Medicaid Assisted Treatment is an option for some 16-17 and 18-21 years of age, but they must meet medical necessity, permission from child services, been through drug free treatment twice, and dependent for a long time.

Liz manipulates the data element for the survey. The Survey should be completed by 4/22/16.

IV. Strategic Planning – Angie Smith-Butterwick

a. Template from JBS

According to JBS, we are required to use this template. Angie will e-mail the template to everyone.

b. Interagency Council portion of template

Angie went over all the objectives, however, more specific objectives and activities are needed. The goals were reviewed in order to develop the specific objectives and activities to develop our financial map. Angie asks the group for broad tasks. The group went on to categorically define each objective and assigning activity related. Angie mentioned we have family support work and outreach to do, so a query will be sent out to all the state youth coordinators to see who has peer services for adolescents. Liz says Brook will do a literature search on national models. For the service delivery system, these models will help us determine the direction we want to take.

c. Subcommittee Meeting Plan

Meetings will start in May 2016. Will be sending out a query to find out which days are best for you to meet. A strategic planning facilitator will be retained. The financial mapping webinar is on Monday, March 20, 2016 from 12 to 1:00 pm. Larry stresses attendance at this webinar. Site visit agenda will also be sent. Interviews for coordinator are complete.
