About Us

- MMP is a surveillance program designed to learn more about the experiences and needs of people living with HIV. It is supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and conducted by local health departments.
- MMP helps determine how many people with HIV are receiving care and what needs are unmet.

What We Did

• From 2009 to 2014, MMP interviewed 939 HIV-positive adults receiving care in Michigan. Their responses reflect their experiences during the 12 months prior to the interview.



What We Learned


Characteristics of HIV-Positive Adults in Care in Michigan, 2009-2014

- 76% were male and 22% were female
- 51% were men who have sex with men
- 57% were black/African-American, 533% were white, and 5% were Hispanic or Latino
- 48% had public insurance only, 36% had private insurance, and 10% had Ryan White coverage only
- 44% had a household income at or below the poverty line
- 9% experienced homelessness
- 49% were currently smokers
- 21% engaged in binge drinking
